Vocational Studies

Business/Enterprise and Economics:



In Key Stage 4, students are participating in the Newcastle United Foundation Premier League Enterprise Programme. This programme uses the power of football to motivate students to be more active, to participate in a wide range of sports, to learn, to be more employable, to be healthier, to overcome obstacles, to respect themselves and each other, to have fun and to reach their potential. Premier League Enterprise is a national programme that is delivered by 27 football clubs across the country and is designed to focus on football clubs as a business

model and give our students an insight of the day to day running on how a club operates. When they have completed the Premier League Enterprise course, students will receive an ASDAN certificate and also a trip to St James' Park for a stadium tour.



KS5 BTEC Business Students:

Yr 13 Business students visited the Metro Centre Gateshead. They had very interesting talks on Visual Merchandising from the Next store and the Entertainer Toy store and managed to get back stage access to how the businesses are run. One student has already made up their mind that this is the career for them after being inspired by the talk. Students are working hard on their 1920s to 1990s hairstyles, and today's fashions. Looking forward to a visit to a hair salon after half term.




Construction





5 Minute Walk Plan

To encourage our pupils to have at least 5 minutes of exercise each morning, and to help us as a school to be good neighbours to those who live near the campus, we ask that parents/carers should arrange to drop-off and collect pupils anywhere on the green routes shown on the "5 Minute Walk" map below. Any point on the green route takes no more than 5 minutes to walk to the pupil entrance, and the dashed green lines show some of the many potential walking routes onto campus. The roads in red are part of our "Good Neighbour Traffic Exclusion Zone", and we would encourage parents/carers not to drive onto the red roads within 30 minutes before or after school arrival and departure times. This allows the roads to be kept free for approved transport of pupils with disabilities, and for county buses.
