English News...

On Wednesday 8th November, the English Enrichment club visited Vue Cinema in Cramlington to see a recording of a live performance of Hamlet at the Bristol Old Vic. We were very excited given that the overview on the website told us it was a "visceral production directed by John Haidar" and that he "excavates the dark subconscious of Shakespeare's greatest Tragedy". We were not disappointed!

The staging was very powerful, Elsinore appeared as an unforgiving grey expanse which really allowed the incredible talents of the cast to shine. This was the first time seeing Shakespeare's work performed live for the students and they were pleasantly surprised by how accessible it was. One of the more surprising elements for the students was the actors speaking in their own modern accents which they felt allowed the actors to express their characters' emotions more realistically. Additionally, as we were the only group booked in for this production, we had the whole cinema hall to ourselves and were able to sit in the VIP section which was very enjoyable.

Following the trip, members of the group shared their views: "The comedic relief, the acting and the story line made the performance enjoyable. The costuming was effective, Claudius's costume gave him a very villainous presence."

"I enjoyed the modern take on Hamlet. I also loved the production quality, the lighting, the sound effects and the stage directions. They executed the play brilliantly and the characters on stage grasped my attention at every moment. The special effects were clean and precise along with the incredible acting. Each actor embodied their role perfectly."

"I enjoyed the modern twist to the story and the comedic relief. Another thing I enjoyed was the clever ways they did their special effects like the blood released when the characters are injured."

"I enjoyed the unique way they portrayed the storyline by using more modern equipment and clothing instead of something more traditional for the time it was written."

Overall it was an amazing experience and we enjoyed every second (all 10,800 of them!).



Errichment and Revision

KS4 English Enrichment Club runs every Thursday 3-4pm, we also have our own Google Classroom where lectures, videos and other resources are shared. So far we have explored: Fairy tales and their importance in Literature, modern reworkings of Fairy tales (focus on Carol Ann Duffy's poetry), Gothic Literature (a recorded discussion led by Chris Bolek, Professor of English Literature, University College London for the BBC), Social class in Austen's Pride and Prejudice, Hamlet, Shakespeare's Tragedies (recorded lecture from Dr. Hester Lees, Cambridge University) and the Christmas ghost story tradition.

The club encourages and nurtures a love of English outside of the curriculum. It is not revision* but is great for year 10 and 11 students who are aiming for grades 7+.
