SIXTH FORM STUDENTS VISIT PEGSWOOD FIRE STATION



As part of Road Safety Week, we collapsed our Year 13 timetable on 12th October to visit Pegswood Fire Station. The statistics below are scary and we wanted our students to understand that passing your driving test is a privilege but it comes with great responsibility.

Visiting the station allowed the Fire Service to provide an insight into how they respond to road traffic collisions and gave students some important messages to take away.

Drivers aged 16-19 are a third more likely to lose their life in a Road Traffic Collision than drivers aged 40-49.

Approximately one in four 18-24year olds (23%) are involved in a crash within 2 years of passing their driving test.

Sport's achievements

Sport is a huge part of our offering here at Duke's Sixth Form. Students can not only study for a Level 3 Diploma in Sport and Physical Activity (equivalent to 2 A Levels) but they can also develop their own skills and play competitive matches through our football enrichment programme.
