



3 Steps to Effective Examination Preparation



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Filling in the gaps means to identify areas of the curriculum that you either have missing from your notes or are not confident that you understand. Not filling in gaps in your notes before you begin to revise will mean that you will not fully understand the course or topic and will leave you unprepared if that aspect of the course comes up in the final examinations.





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You can check whether you have gaps by checking your notes against:

- Knowledge organisers
- Topic checklists
- Exam board specifications







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Once you have identified any areas that you have missing, or are less confident on, prioritise these in your note making. Use the following to help you complete your notes and 'fill the gaps' in your knowledge:

- Your teacher
- Google Classroom
- Textbooks
- Knowledge organisers
- Revision guides
