Sharing information

The process of sharing information between primary and secondary is already well underway. Staff from the Primaries and Duke's are communicating to ensure that your child's needs are understood by their new teachers. Information is shared sensitively and confidentially about your child's academic and social and emotional needs to enable the right support to be put into place before they start in September.

Additional Support

Children with additional needs or those who may find the transition particularly difficult will be supported with additional transition sessions at their own primary school, led by specialist staff from Duke's.

Curriculum Continuity

Staff from Duke's will be visiting primary schools this term to get to know the children and the ways in which they are used to working. This will help to maintain continuity in the curriculum and learning.

Chromebooks

Duke's offers a fantastic Chromebook scheme which gives all students the chance to purchase a Chrome book on a 'pay monthly' basis. The costs are subsidised and the chromebooks are set up with all the software needed for use in school and at home. Look out for further information coming to you soon!

CAT4 assessments

This half term staff from Duke's will work with your child's Y6 teacher to put them into learning groups ready for September. All children will complete an online CAT4 assessment which will be done in the classroom or ICT suite at their primary school.

These tests are not something children can prepare for, or need to worry about, but help us to understand how they think rather than what they know. By doing this work before they come to Duke's we will be able to group them for learning, in classes that suit them best, before they start. The Year 6 teachers will share their knowledge and help us make sure they are in a class where they feel happy and ready to learn. We are hoping this will lead to a smooth start to year 7 for everyone.

We're here for you

The Director of Primary to Secondary Transition here at Duke's is Katie Black, she is working closely with your child's primary school and the team at Duke's to oversee the transition process. We know that this is a big step for both parents and children and you may have some questions.

Hopefully, lots of these can be answered during the transition days or when Duke's staff come to primary schools to meet you.
