- During this process we will be here to guide you. Sometimes the
 aspirations of some students don't quite match what you are capable of.
 We will make sure that the subjects you start in year 10 give you the
 best chance of gaining as many qualifications as possible.

WHAT IS THE

The EBacc was introduced into schools in England by the government in the expectation that the majority of children will work towards GCSEs in five core academic subjects

This gives the widest range of future further study and career opportunities

EBACC? The EBacc is:

- English
- Mathematics
- Science
- History or Geography
- Language (French)







The EBacc is made up of the subjects which are considered essential to many degrees and open up lots of doors.

The curriculum structure at Duke's ensures that those pupils who may enjoy or benefit from studying the EBacc can do so, and therefore meet these government aspirations. However, the EBacc will not serve the needs of all our pupils, and our options blocks allow pupils to follow a programme of study that involves a broader spectrum of subjects.












THE HIGHLIGHT

- 8 GCSEs as per government guidance
- This includes Maths, English Language, English Literature and either Dual or Triple Science
- Dual Science Students = One option from each of the three option blocks
- Triple Science Students = One option from Option Block 2 and 3 only!
- All students will also complete core studies in Religious Studies, PE and PSHCE
- EBacc route? Choose either History or Geography and French as two of your choices
- You will also have a choice of taking GCSE Religious Studies instead of the core RS offer
- You can't take the same subject more than once
- A reserve choice must be selected and could be used if any of the courses become oversubscribed



THE HIGHLIGHT

- For this year we have introduced a new 14-16 Engineering
 Skills Academy
- This is a course run jointly with **Northumberland College**
- This course is totally different from the other GCSE pathways that we offer
- Students who take this course will spend 3 days in school receiving lessons on English, maths and science
- They will then spend two days in college taking an engineering qualification and being involved in a range of work experience in the engineering sector
- To be considered for this course you have to have the potential to gain a grade 5 or above in English, maths and science at GCSE









A joint venture between

- A bespoke curriculum including a high quality GCSE qualification in Engineering as well as in English, Mathematics and Science

- Direct progression routes into further education, apprenticeship and employment

14-16 Engineering Skills Academy

For 2025 we are excited to offer a combined engineering pathway delivered jointly by Duke's and Northumberland College

The course

Full details of the course are still to be confirmed at the time of writing this prospectus entry but the 14-16 Engineering Skills Academy programme will see Duke's students taught at school on an English, maths and science curriculum for 3 days per week and then at Northumberland College for the remaining 2 days where they will work on a high quality level 2 engineering qualification and will partake in a range of work related activities including:

- Work experience and industry placements
- Industry masterclasses
- Visits and experience days
- Employer based project learning

This is a flagship pathway and acceptance on the course will be on the basis of Y9 performance in English, maths and science which indicates that the student will, by the end of Year 11, be at least able to reach Grade 5 in each of those subjects.
