- 2) Many people feel awe and wonder when they look at the natural world is because it helps them believe that God created the world.

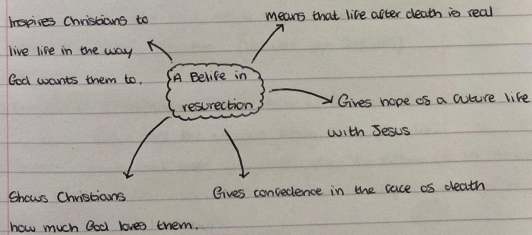
Symbolic belief

ENLIGHTENED PATH

The four noble truths are

1. Dukkha
  2. Desire
  3. Freedom
  4. Enlightenment
- 1) Right understanding - learning and accepting the Buddha's teaching
  - 2) Right intention - having good will and wanting to do what's right
  - 3) Right speech - speaking the truth avoiding abusive language or gossip
  - 4) Right action - acting kindly and peacefully
  - 5) Right livelihood - making a living in a way that doesn't cause harm
  - 6) Right effort - trying to keep a positive mindset
  - 7) Right mindfulness - building awareness of the body, and states of mind
  - 8) Right concentration - developing the mental focus necessary to reach enlightenment

A sacrament where a person affirms their faith and they receive the Holy Spirit, often through laying on of hands and anointing with oil by committing to Christianity.



A sacrament in which Christians receive the body and blood of Christ, usually in the form of bread and wine, commemorating the last supper.

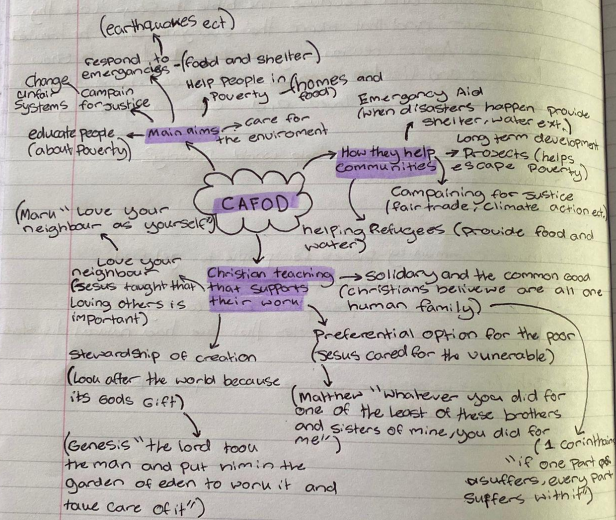

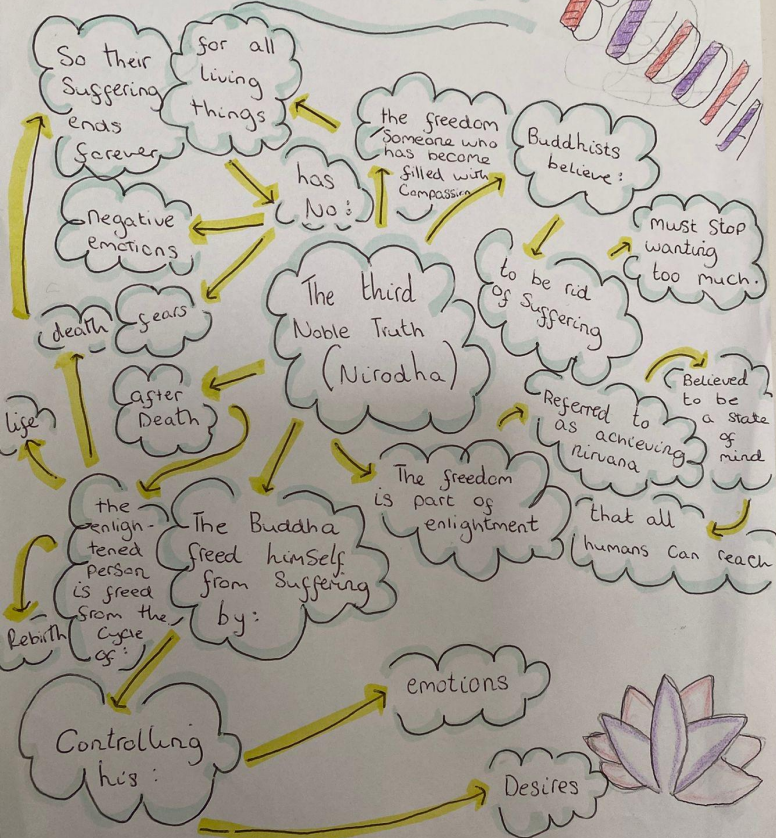

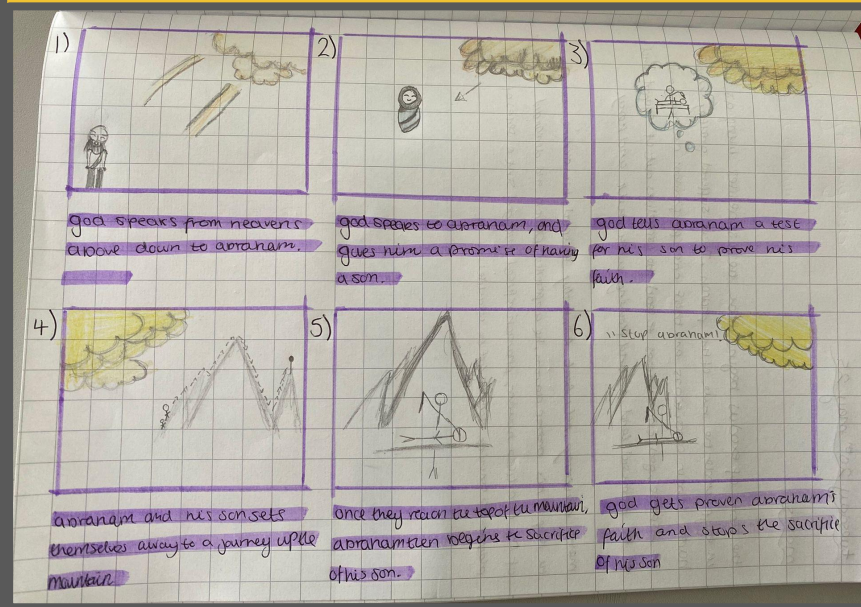
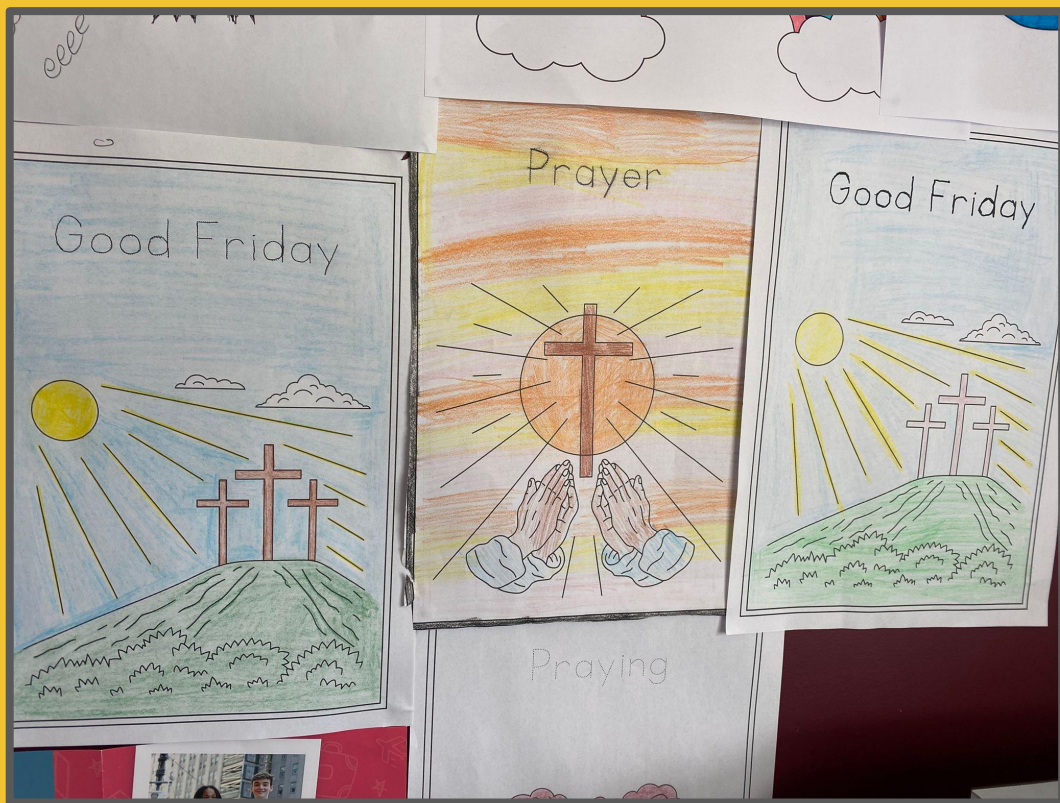
Some people would disagree that offenders should be punished Severely. They would disagree with this because some people might not have done something that bad and people should get second chances.
