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
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Spotlight on Lilly – Our Talented Student Photographer

CCF – TEAMWORK, CHALLENGE, & CAMOUFLAGE



During Activity Week, our cadets took part in a dynamic and engaging CCF experience that combined teamwork, physical challenge, and tactical skills.

The day began with a full safety briefing for staff and pupils, followed by sessions on camouflage and concealment. Cadets explored the theory behind how and why things are seen before testing their skills in a practical concealment exercise on the main field. Staff supervision ensured a safe and structured session where students were encouraged to think critically and creatively.

After a short break and staff briefing, cadets moved on to the physical training (PT) element held on the 3G pitch. This high-energy session tested their resilience, stamina, and teamwork. Staff participation was welcomed, creating a positive and motivating environment for all. In the afternoon, the much-anticipated battle exercise brought all elements together. Students applied their camouflage and fitness training in a final activity that was both fun and physically demanding. Staff supported pupils who preferred not to participate, ensuring everyone remained included and safe.



Thrills and Wildlife: A Day at Yorkshire's Premier Theme Park & Zoo




