Bishop's Primary will use the funds to support pupils to catch up lost teaching during school closures. All spending will be allocated to activities targeted towards closing the gap created by the COVID-19 pandemic. It is not expected that there will be a spend of £80 on each and every pupil in schools. The government has made it clear that the spending of this money will be down to schools to allocate as they see fit.

CATCH UP PRIORITIES

At Bishop's Primary we have identified a number of catch-up priorities, based on assessment, engagement in remote learning and in class observation.

Evidence shows that generally numeracy has been impacted to a greater degree than literacy in key stage 2. Assessments and subsequent analysis has identified the children that have fallen behind and the specific gaps in their knowledge.

In early years literacy is the area of learning in most need of support.

Evidence shows that pupils identified as disadvantaged have not been disproportionally effected by school closure, with similar proportions of nondisadvantaged pupils requiring catch-up.

Phonics and early reading are behind the typical attainment standards that would be expected for key stage 1 and early years.
