



God's Garden – Mini Beasts through Mini Eyes



Our Reception and Dragonflies have explored the beauty and wonder of God's creation through curious eyes and caring hearts. From the tiniest ladybird to the tallest tree, every part of the world around us tells a story of love, life, and connection.



Inspired by the idea that all of God's creatures—big and small—are special and worthy of care, the children created a vibrant, joyful artwork that celebrates mini beasts and nature in all its forms. They created ladybirds with spotty red backs, wriggly worms, buzzing bees, slimy snails and slender spiders. The children explored the beauty and uniqueness of each creature, discussing how even the smallest of God's creations has a special purpose. They transformed simple stones into beautiful works of art, showing their appreciation for nature and all living things. Each mini beast was carefully imagined and brought to life with a big dose of creativity.



Our older Dragonflies have been busy using their hands and creativity to make a beautiful proggy mat to represent grass - using their fine motor skills to poke and pull the pieces through the matting, our little learners took on the challenge with excitement and care. As they worked, we talked about how grass feels and looks, and how we can use textures and colours to show nature in art. The children loved the sensory experience and were proud to see their patch of 'grass' grow bit by bit.



Displayed together, the collection is a joyful celebration of the children's curiosity, creativity, and the wonders of the tiny creatures that live all around us.

Their entry reminds us that even the smallest hands can make a big difference when we connect with and care for God's world.
