# Long Term Plan

This Long Term Scheme of Work meets the requirements of the National Curriculum.

The Long Term Scheme of Work has been developed in order to provide an accessible, broad and balanced, progressive, sequential plan for the teaching of History. The substantive content has been carefully chosen to reflect and extend learners' awareness, understanding and knowledge.

More information is available in the History Rationale.

The teaching of History should be skills based as well as knowledge based. Children will have the opportunity to learn both through a balance of guided, planned teaching and pursuing their own learning within an enabling environment.

A high-quality History education will help pupils gain a coherent knowledge and understanding of Britain's past and that of the wider world.

#### **Early Years**

Seven key features of effective practice as identified in the DfE Development Matters guidance (July 2021): The best for every child; High-quality care; The Curriculum; Pedagogy; Assessment; Self-regulation and executive function; Partnership with parents.

In planning and guiding what children learn, practitioners will reflect on the 3 characteristics of effective learning: playing and exploring, active learning, creating and thinking critically.

In Castle School we use Cherry Garden as a teaching and assessment tool. Although all of the six Cherry Garden areas may come into the teaching of 'History' in the Early Years, Understanding the World has the strongest ties to History especially the strand People and Communities,.

#### **People and Communities**

- Branch 5 Is curious about people and shows interest in stories about themselves and their family.

  - In pretend play, imitates everyday actions and events from own family and cultural background, e.g. making and drinking tea

- Branch 10 Can talk about past events in their own lives and in the lives of family members
