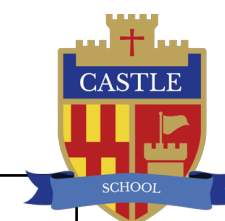




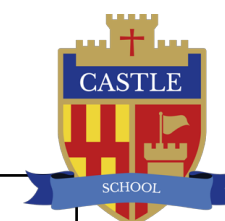

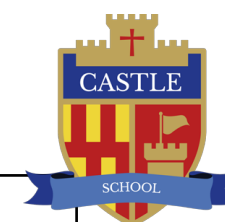

Road Safety Week	Practise crossing roads, traffic light games, trike obstacle course, explore emergency vehicles, visit from community police if possible.	Police officer, lollipop person, bus driver, paramedic, firefighter.	Safety awareness, listening, following routines.
Christmas Enterprise	Make simple crafts to sell, decorate biscuits, wrap gifts, run a class stall, count money using play coins.	Shop assistant, baker, florist, craft maker, cashier.	Independence, communication, counting, teamwork, confidence.

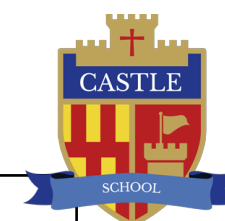


Pancake Day Café	Make simple pancakes, mix ingredients, choose toppings, serve classmates or families, role-play a café.	Chef, baker, waiter/waitress, café assistant, cleaner.	Turn taking, following instructions, fine motor skills, communication, independence.
National Careers Week	Dress up as different occupations, role-play jobs, invite school staff to talk about their roles, read books about jobs.	Teachers, cleaners, office staff, cooks, site manager, nurses and other familiar roles.	Curiosity, speaking and listening, confidence, understanding the world.
British Science Week	Simple experiments (floating/sinking, magnets, colour mixing), sensory investigations, prediction games.	Scientist, engineer, laboratory technician, inventor.	Problem solving, questioning, observation, communication.
Child Safety Week – People Who Keep Us Safe	Meet emergency services (where possible), explore emergency vehicles, practise asking for help, road safety games.	Police officer, firefighter, paramedic, crossing patrol, nurse.	Personal safety, listening, recognising trusted adults, confidence.
Summer Fair	Prepare games, decorate stalls, sell crafts, ice cream role play, welcome families, celebrate achievements.	Shop assistant, entertainer, event organiser, caterer.	Communication, confidence, teamwork, independence.

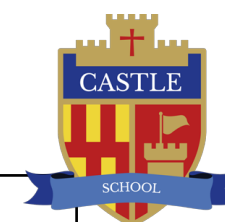

Black History Month (October)	Explore music, fabrics, sensory stories, food aromas and artwork from different cultures using multisensory experiences.	Introduce creative roles such as musicians, artists, dancers and chefs.	Curiosity, sensory exploration, cultural awareness, shared attention.
Harvest Festival	Sensory exploration of fruit, vegetables, straw and soil, planting bulbs, harvest songs, tasting seasonal foods, donating food items.	Farmers, gardeners, supermarket workers and delivery drivers help provide food for communities.	Cause and effect, sensory tolerance, communication, early independence.
Anti-Bullying Week	Intensive interaction, turn-taking games, emotion symbols, kindness activities, sensory friendship stories and shared play.	Teachers, therapists and support staff help people feel safe and included.	Social interaction, emotional regulation, communication, positive relationships.
Children in Need	Pudsey-themed sensory trays, charity craft making, music and movement, simple fundraising activities with families.	Community volunteers and charity workers help others.	Participation, community awareness, engagement, shared experiences.

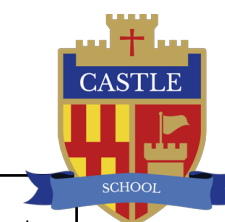

Road Safety Week	Sensory traffic light activities, wheelchair or walking routes around school, listening to road sounds, exploring emergency vehicles through sensory play. Christmas Enterprise	Decorate biscuits, create sensory crafts to sell, wrap gifts, choose decorations, participate in a class enterprise event.	Bakers, shop assistants, florists, delivery drivers and craft makers prepare for celebrations.	Choice making, engagement, communication, participation, independence.
Pancake Day Café	Mix ingredients, explore textures and smells, choose toppings, take turns serving, café role play using communication aids.	Chefs, café assistants, servers and cleaners work together in cafés.	Turn taking, requesting, sensory exploration, following routines.
National Careers Week	Explore real objects linked to jobs (uniforms, tools, equipment), meet familiar school staff, role-play simple community jobs through sensory experiences.	Develop awareness that different people have different jobs within school and the community.	Curiosity, communication, recognition of familiar roles, engagement with the wider world.
British Science Week	Sensory science including bubbles, light, water, magnets, sound, colour mixing and cause-and-effect experiments.	Scientists, engineers and laboratory technicians investigate and solve problems.	Curiosity, anticipation, observation, exploration, problem solving.

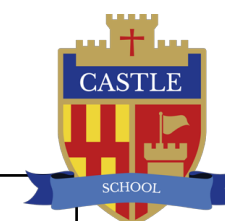

Summer Fair	Prepare simple crafts, sensory games, music, outdoor activities, welcome visitors, participate in class stalls. 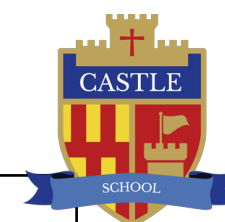
