Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

Summer Fair, New Library and Early Years

I am very excited to announce that we will be creating a new library space at the entrance to the school. Whilst I personally thought this was a very clever idea, our more veteran teachers tell me this thought is not new and is a return to how things used to be a few years ago!

We want to create a lovely space for our children and visitors to enjoy, for every nook and cranny to be a reading-friendly place that celebrates our love of reading across the school and promote all things to do with books.

We had hoped to receive funding for the library from Warkworth Parish Council but, unfortunately, our recent grant application was rejected much to our disappointment and despite the fantastic efforts of CIIr Burke. Therefore, we now hope that the Summer Fair will raise enough money for bespoke bookcases, reading furniture and various exciting resources for the Early Years outdoor area. In addition, I have requested an invite to the parish council to restate our case for support!

Watch this space and look out for further messages on Dojo re: the Summer Fair on the afternoon of Wednesday 5th July!










Returning Book Bag Books

School Council

We are very excited that the School Council will be restarting next academic year! As Mrs Frater put on Class Dojo, elections will be held on 14/6/23.

The S.E.A. Squad will continue and be open to all, focusing on social and environmental issues, whilst the School Council will embody the British Value of democracy by being elected and considering school-based issues. We know from early manifestos received that playground equipment is high on the agenda!

New Lunch Time Clubs

A number of parents have got in touch with me about clubs, some requesting more specific clubs (e.g. requesting more sports), some saying that they would like their children in clubs but that they cannot fit ones after school into their schedule etc.

With this in mind, I met with teachers who kindly agreed to give up their lunchtimes once a week to run clubs that all can join. We will send out information in the coming weeks via Arbor allowing parents to sign their children up for clubs starting from September. These will be instead of afterschool clubs (with the exception of Trident Soccer which will continue on Fridays).

One club that is of particular interest to me is our new choir – two volunteers from St Lawrence's Church are very kindly going to donate their time to help set up a more formal choir, with a view towards performances one day in the future! The aim I set is to hopefully be singing Christmas Carols in public when that time of year comes around. They will sing a variety of different songs, from hymns to pop songs. I am beyond excited so watch this space!









Wraparound

From September 2023, there will be new fees for our Breakfast Club and Afterschool Club. As you will be aware, school funding is a significant national issue and, without getting too political (!), let's just say that schools are being expected to do a lot more with a lot less money. From food costs soaring (as we all see every time we go to the supermarket...) to salaries (rightly) being increased considerably too, for our Breakfast Clubs and After School Clubs to continue, it is essential that it is costeffective. The costs will be as follows:

- Breakfast Club: £4.50 a session
 7:30am-Start of school day
 Includes breakfast
 (Except for children who are classified as Pupil Premium where it will be paid for by the school.)
- After-School Club: £9.50 a session End of school day-5:15pm Includes a snack (Or until 5:30pm by special request, agreed with Mrs Gibson at a total session cost of £12).

We are asking parents to submit their bookings **two weeks in advance** by using the Arbor system.

Emergency bookings will be authorised in exceptional circumstances – please speak to Mrs Gibson first to arrange this.

We are charging for whole sessions and requesting two weeks' notice because this allows us to set the staff rotas and ensure our staff-to-child ratios are correct. Payment will be taken at the time of booking.

The current system is not working adequately as staff are, out of the kindness of their heart, being deployed last minute and not always knowing how long they are needed for. You'll all know how wonderful Mrs Dixon, Miss Pringle, Miss Wright, Ms Young, Miss Wilkie and everyone else who helps with Wraparound are – they have regularly gone above and beyond, staying much later than expected with little to no notice, but I wish to make sure that we can plan out their duties better. These fees and arrangements remain competitive compared to other providers and will continue to give value for money in this challenging time.



Sports Day

Mrs Frater sent a letter about Sports Day today which will happen the same day as the Summer Fair (the morning of Wednesday 5th July). We are very excited!













Everyone Is Awesome Week!

On week commencing 3rd July, school will proudly continue the traditional annual Everyone Is Awesome week which is focused on inclusivity and particularly highlighting Special Educational Needs both in our school and across the world. It was the genius idea of a child with autism at the school who wanted the other children in school to understand why and how he was different and celebrate it.

Forest School and PE Uniform Days

Parents, children and teaching staff seem to like children coming into school in their PE kits on PE and Forest School days so this will continue next academic year.

Children will continue to have PE for two lessons a week – depending on the sport, this may mean that they only need PE kit once a week or maximum twice a week.

Forest School will continue to be weekly for Early Years, it will be twice a half-term for Years 1 and 2, and once a half-term for Y3-6.

The exact days will be shared by new class teachers next academic year but I know that families wanted to know the frequency so that they could buy the right amount of uniform for the year ahead.



Summer Holiday Club

We are delighted to announce a possible *free* holiday club, run by Luis from LASP Outdoors, on site in school from Monday 21st to Thursday 24th August. Invited pupils are from Year 2 upwards (with potential for Year 1 depending on numbers) and it will run from 9am to 1pm for the four days including PE, arts and crafts and teambuilding exercises.
