Year 5	 There are 21 countries that surround the Mediterranean Sea, and this is known as the Mediterranean region. The largest countries of the area include: Italy, Greece, Libya and Spain. The Mediterranean Region is also known as the Mediterranean Basin. The Mediterranean Sea covers about 970,000 square miles (2,510,000 square kilometers). In the west, a narrow waterway called the Strait of Gibraltar connects the Mediterranean with the Atlantic Ocean. The Dardanelles Strait, the Sea of Marmara, and the Bosporus Strait connect the Mediterranean to the Black Sea in the northeast. In the southeast, the Suez Canal links the Mediterranean to the Red Sea. The large islands of the Mediterranean include Corsica, Sardinia, Sicily, Crete, and Cyprus. The region has mild, wet winters and hot, dry summers.
