Homework

Thank you for your ongoing support with your child's learning at home.

We will again be using a homework grid that includes All About Me and 40 Things tasks, as well as subject-based homework tasks. The expectation is that 6 pieces of homework will be completed over the half term. The final date for homework to be handed in is 17/12/25 (the last Wednesday).

Science

In science, we will be looking at forces including gravity, friction and air and water resistance. We will test the theories and find out about famous scientists linked to these discoveries.

English

This half term, we will be learning about the structure and features of a non-chronological report. We will learn how to take notes effectively, and to expand them and use them to produce our own report about Anglo-Saxon Britain. Our work on grammar and spellings will continue in weekly lessons. Guided reading sessions will continue each day.

Maths

During this half term, our maths will cover addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We will learn formal methods for multiplication and division calculations.

Please note, a thorough knowledge of times tables and related division facts is crucial to developing skills in all of these areas, so continued regular practise at home is essential. Your support with this will be of huge benefit to your children!

RE and PSHE

In RE we will be answering the question What would Jesus do? Can we live by the values of Jesus in the 21st century?

Our PSHE focus this term is 'Respecting ourselves and others'. Our discussions will focus around responding respectfully to a wide range of people; recognising prejudice and discrimination. This will include racism, sexism, and homophobia.

Art & Design Technology

Our main focus this half term will be textiles where we will develop different skills which we will then use to make an Anglo-Saxon utility belt.

Music

We will listen to and perform songs linked to our topic and continue to learn how to play the recorder and read musical notation.

Computing

The children will learn coding skills following the Purple Mash scheme.

PE

This half term we will be practising our gymnastics skills. Our outdoor games lesson will continue on Thursday. Please make sure your child has the correct kit on these days, including a warm top for colder days.
