A big thank you also to the 4 parents who came with us on the trip. We could not have done it without you!

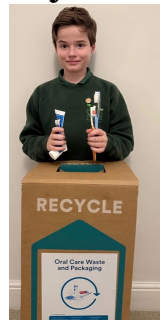
Heaton's Sports Club
