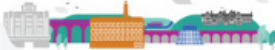

Help and support with SEN

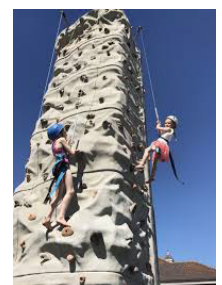
Information and Advice Sessions offered by the One Family Stockport Hubs provide a supportive and informal opportunity for parents and carers to seek advice, guidance and reassurance. These sessions focus on SEND and neurodiversity and are designed to help families better understand the support available for children and young people. Parents and carers can speak directly with staff from a range of local support services, ask questions, and discuss any concerns they may have about their child's needs. The sessions are informal and welcoming, with no referral needed, and are suitable whether families are looking for early advice, exploring next steps, or simply wanting to find out what support is available locally. 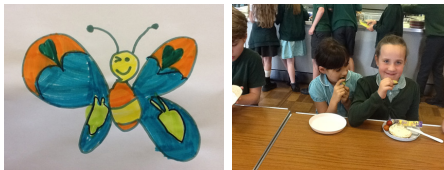
Parent and Carer Survey 2026
