Year 6 is an exciting and busy year, and so we want to support you in every way we can. Maths

This term the children will be securing their knowledge of place value and the four operations (+ - $x \div$). They will be using long multiplication and introduced to long division. If you would like any help with how we carry out these calculations to help children, please do not hesitate to see a teacher. We will then learn about fractions (simplifying, adding, subtracting, multiplying, dividing, finding fractions of amounts). After this, we will look at position and direction.

Weekly 'times tables tests' will be completed on a Friday. Please support your child in learning their times tables – you could quiz them on the way to and from school!

TTRockstars is a brilliant way of having fun whilst learning times tables. Look out for battles

against other classes!







This term we will be studying the three themes of: Domestic Church (Family), Baptism and Confirmation (Belonging) and Advent and Christmas (Loving). We are encouraging the children to become philosophers by engaging in philosophy lessons at the start of each topic to answer the BIG question. We will also study Judaism as our other religion.

In Year 6, the children will be encouraged to increase their depth of religious knowledge and understanding by exploring a variety of religious sources such as hymns, artwork, prayers and scripture.





This term in English, we will be writing different genres linking to our flistory topic about African American Civil Rights. We will be writing a biography about Katherine Johnson who was an African American employed by NASA, during a time of segregation, and contributed greatly to America's success in 'The Space Race'. As well as this, we will be looking at Bob Dylan's 'Emmett Till' and Martin Luther King's speech in Washington D.C for the inspiration for diary entries associated with the Civil Rights Movement.

Children will be using higher level punctuation and using a range of sentence types to make their writing effective.

We will also be working hard on our handwriting, spelling and presentation.

Science



During the Autumn term we will be learnin evolution and inheritance. Within this we will begin by creating different types of fossils and learning about what they show us. We will then go on to look at how all animals, including humans have evolved to the species they are today. As well as this, we will explore electric circuits and how different components can be used.

PSHC



To highlight the importance of PSHC, we will be participating in PSHC launch day where we look at an individual lesson from each of the three strands: relationships, living in the wider world and health and wellbeing. From there we will teach an individual lesson once a week which provides the children with lots of opportunities for engaging discussions.

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Our P.C lessons this topic will be delivered by Jamie Poole and supported by our teaching staff. For the first half term we will be developing our skills within tag rugby before we go on to practise basketball (boys) and netball (girls). The children will learn the rules of basketball and tag rugby and develop ball skills including passing backwards and scoring.

They will practise various techniques and then practise these against their opponents. The children will build on their teamwork skills from last year. Please remember to have PC Kits in school (white tops/red shorts and trainers).

French

Bonjour! In French our topic will be, 'Le Weekend' where we will be talking about activities, earning to ask and say what others do, talk about what we like and dislike and writing a diary in French.



Art, Music and D&T

In art we will create a story quilt as a class. Cach individual pupil will research an inspirational figure and will use painting, stitching and fabric pen skills to decorate their own individual piece of fabric before a class quilt is made.

In D&T children will be using their electricity skills learned in Science to make their very own light-up game. The games will be similar to 'Operation' where they use LCD lights and sounds as a "warning" when the circuit is complete.

In Music we will be learning 'Happy' by Pharrell Williams.

Computing

We will be learning about C-safety ensuring that the children know can safely use a variety of devices as well as knowing what to do if they come across any inappropriate content.

We will also start to look at eoding by using a programme called Scratch. The children will be given a variety of scenarios to create such as stories and games.

History & Geography

Our History topic will also be the Civil Rights movement. We will start by looking at the transatlantic slave trade and move chronologically forward up to present day. Particular events we will look at will be the abolition of slavery, peaceful and violent protests and inspirational figures such as Katherine Johnson and Martin Luther King.



Homework

Reading is very important! Please listen to your ehild read every night if possible (minimum 3 times a week) and ensure they bring their reading book and record to school every day. It would be appreciated if you could also write a comment to let us know how your child is getting on at home with their reading.

Spellings will continue to be sent home every other Friday. Please help your child to learn their words each week for a test on the following Thursday.
