A small number of children have returned to school wearing earrings. Our uniform policy, set by our school governors and Trust, clearly states that children must not wear earrings for school. It is very important that we comply with this due to health and safety reasons. Any child wearing earrings for school will not be able to take part in PE lessons and will be restricted at break times too. Obviously, none of us want children to miss these essential activities at school, but we must put the safety of our children first. Covering the earrings is not enough to prevent accidents happening. We would ask parents and carers of children who have their ears pierced to remove the earrings before bringing their child to school. We thank you for your support with this.

### **Attendance**

Once again, we ask for your support in ensuring your child has excellent attendance at school. Our aim for all children is to have a minimum of 97% attendance over the school year. To achieve 97% attendance, a child will miss six school days over the course of the year. We understand children get poorly and some time off school may be unavoidable, however, we do encourage you to work with us to ensure your child is at school as much as possible as this ensures they learn as well as they can. We cannot authorise holidays in term time and parents may face penalty fines for taking children out of school.
