School Uniform

Thank you to the parents, carers and children who support us in attending school looking smart in their school uniform. All children should come to school in full school uniform, including our school tie. Children are expected to wear black school shoes,

trainers are not permitted. For PE sessions, children should wear a white t-shirt and red shorts. An outdoor PE kit is also needed for KS2 children. Our school PTA have various items of preloved uniform that is available if you wish to use it.

Attendance

At Christ the King we encourage high attendance as statistics show that pupils with good attendance have higher attainment in school and studies show that children with attendance above 96% make better progress socially and academically.

The table below demonstrates how much school children miss if they are absent and it is surprising how this adds up:

If your child misses	That equals	Which is	over 13 years schooling
1 day every 2 weeks	20 days per year	4 weeks per year	Nearly 1 ½ years
1 day per week	40 days per year	8 weeks per year	Over 2 ½ years
2 days per week	80 days per year	16 weeks per year	Over 5 years
3 days per week	120 days per year	24 weeks per year	Over 8 years

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We understand that sometimes illness does strike and if your child is ill with a fever or sickness, then guidance says to keep them off school until they feel better and the fever has resolved. Please inform the school office if your child is absent by 9am each day.

We celebrate good attendance through our half-termly attendance raffle, where children earn a raffle ticket for each full week they are in school. Also, congratulations to the 60 children who achieved 100% attendance last term!

Extra-Curricular activities

Once again we have a great range of extra-curricular activities for children to attend after school. A huge thank you to our staff for leading these, as well as Jamie Poole and his coaching team. Please ensure that you book a place for your child on our Arbor system.
