What is the Year 7 literacy and numeracy catch up premium?

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support Year 7 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard (pupils scoring at least 100 will have met the expected standard in the test) in reading or maths at the end of Key Stage 2 (KS2).

This year, due to COVID-19, Year 7 pupils did not sit their end of KS2 assessments. Instead, at Sacred Heart, we bought a suite of GL Assessments (Granada Learning - previously the NFER) for Year 7 pupils to be assessed in the following:

- CATs tests
- English, Maths and Science Progress Tests
- NGRT (New Group Reading Test)
- NGST (New Group Spelling Test)
- PASS (Pupil Attitude to School and Self)

It is intended that the premium should be used to accelerate the progress of those pupils so that they can catch up to their peers.

As a school we are totally committed to raising the aspirations and standards of achievement of all pupils and there are a number of ways in which we are striving to close gaps in achievement, as outlined in this document.

Lexia reading programme (10 Y7 students with SEND attend lexia upto 4x per week (20 min session)	£1833 per year + staffing costs.	Improvement in phonological awareness, phonics, structural awareness, automaticity, fluency, vocabulary and comprehension.
GL suite of assessments In order to base-line assess the pupils coming into Sacred Heart, we utilised a suite of GL assessments. All year 7 pupils to complete the assessments to give reading ages for all pupils to identify pupils for additional support.	£3,657	Pupils with curriculum needs brought about through lockdown are identified Screening for all pupils who potentially may have been missed in lockdown and require further support and intervention

Reciprocal Reading Programme This intervention involves students attending two 20 minute sessions per week on a one to one basis. Their progress is closely monitored and reviewed over the course of the programme. Hegarty Maths All Y7 pupils have an individual login for Hegarty Maths. This allows students to access online tutorials and support for weaknesses identified. English Tutor (NTP)	£5,688 (a percentage of the total cost used for Y7 catch up)	To support the development of those pupils with a long term absence and in particular any areas of weakness that has been identified by a class teacher. • To work with small groups who are struggling to access the curriculum • Re-visiting content that pupils have difficulty accessing in lessons or remotely so that pupils can increase their knowledge and gain confidence when back in class • To address missed learning due to COVID-19. • In class support in Y7 lessons to support individual pupils as directed by the class teacher.
Maths Tutor (NTP)	£10,483 (a percentage of the total cost used for Y7 catch up)	To support the development of those pupils with a long term absence and in particular any areas of weakness that has been identified by a class teacher. • To work with small groups who struggle with a similar part of the curriculum • Re-teaching of content that pupils found difficulty accessing during lockdown so pupils can access this more confidently in lessons. • To address missed learning due to COVID-19. • In class support in Y7 lessons to support individual pupils as directed by the class teacher.
Science Tutor (NTP)	£15,261 (a percentage of the total cost used for Y7 catch up)	To support the development of those pupils with a long term absence and in particular any areas of weakness that has been identified by a class teacher. • To address missed learning due to COVID-19. • In class support in Y7 lessons to support individual pupils as directed by the class teacher.

Lexia reading programme - Reading ages assessed - Students 2+ chronological years behind were placed onto intervention - Parents were informed and kept up to date with progress - Half termly reading age checks to monitor improvements and tracking of lexia assessment data used to assess progress.	£1833 per year + staffing costs.	54 students accessed Lexia 2019/20 Lexia reading programme - Increased parental engagement in supporting students with literacy - Majority of students in KS3 made progress from foundation level word study, grammar or comprehension (Y4 - 6) onto intermediate level word study, comprehension or grammar (Y7 - 9) before March lockdown.

Lexia began in Autumn term 2, 2019. Due to the lockdown in March 2020, it was not possible to complete this intervention and collect the relevant exit data. Therefore there is no impact data available for Lexia.
