Curriculum Intent for EYFS:

How children learn is both complex and very simple at the same time. They observe, practise, listen, attempt, explore, hypothesise and make sense of their world. At SMC EYFS we understand the vital importance of play in how children learn and we strive to create an Early Years that reflects the needs of our children. We know that children need to feel safe and have their basic needs met and have staff who are responsive to those needs. We know that in order for children to be receptive to learning they need to be engaged and motivated and allowed to think both creatively and critically and we know that they need to do this in an environment where they feel safe to explore and take risks and adults who can respond to their developmental needs.

We understand that where our children come from can influence where they get to. We understand there are many barriers that may prevent them from achieving all they are capable of and we are determined that we will remove as many of these barriers as we can to allow all of the children at SMC to achieve to the best of their ability. As part of our ethos we believe that 'Every child is someone at SMC'. Our intent is to always begin with the child and place them at the centre of the learning we provide.

Curriculum Intent for EYFS:

We will ensure adults working in EYFS encourage positive relationships between themselves and the children in the setting through high expectations of behaviour and daily promotion of the characteristics of reflective learning, We will ensure that the environment the children are in is one that encourages engagement through exploratory play and allows children to discover what they are capable of—an environment that allows children to explore and deepen their understanding. Areas of Provision and Objective Led Planning:

We feel that clearly understanding the connections between the provision inside and out, what we want the children to learn and how we plan this will allow our children to observe, practise, listen, attempt, explore, hypothesise and make sense of their world. This will be achieved through a stimulating environment e.g. the Areas of Provision and Objective Led Planning ensuring the children are able to use their skills independently. We will help our children to develop their characteristics of effective learning promoting independence, resilience and creativity.

Objective led planning will allow staff to address the developmental needs of each and every child in their play. With continuing training of staff ensuring that they understand the typical developmental journey of a child in all of their learning and when and how to intervene if the staff member feels there is a need.

Impact:

Many of the children who enter our Nursery are not at the developmental stage that would be expected for their age. As an EYFS we must make an impact on these children to allow them to leave us at or closer to the expected standard than their trajectory indicated they were on upon entry to Nursery. We must make this impact or we fail the children in our care.
