- To write instructions using accurate vocabulary based on Mr Wolf's Pancakes.
- Reading poetry to help write their own poems.

Reading at Home

Even though schools teach children how to read, parents still have such an important role to play. Research shows that parents who get involved in their child's education make a big difference to how well their children do!

As you will know, we have invested a huge amount of school funds to buy our gorgeous, new Read, Write Inc. Book Bag Books. In school, children read a story per week. The story is exactly matched to their phonic level. To match each school storybook there is a black and white version of the story AND a related story book to read at home.

You may hear your child come home talking about 'dojos' or 'dojo points'.

This is our reading reward scheme in KS1.

Children in KS1 have their own avatar like the ones below. Each day that they read at home, they will earn a 'Dojo Point'.



Certificates for each point milestone will be awarded at the end of every half term and certain stages include a prize (see below).
