Can you believe it's already the final term of the year? The children have worked so hard this year and it is lovely to see all of their hard work starting to pay off with lots of them bringing home story or word blending books and lots of them having a go at writing by themselves too.

This is always a fun term and there is lots to look forward to along with all the hard work. Have a look at the dates for your diary to see what's going on in school for both your child and some events for you to come along to too! We can hardly wait to see you.

Read Write Inc

All of the children now know their set 1 sounds and everyone is learning how to use them in their reading and writing.

All of the children are now either bringing home a ditty sheet or Ditty books. We really appreciate the work you do with the children at home with helping them with their reading, it really makes a difference!

Writing

It is lovely to see so many of the children beginning to use the skills they have developed in RWI in their independent writing. We will continue to work on simple phrases and sentences in class. The children will continue to practise holding their sentence in their head and then writing it by themselves.

Number

This term we are looking at different ways we can add and subtract. The children are getting really good at using their 10 frames and part, part whole models and now they are learning how to count on and back using number tracks.

We are looking at number patterns and beginning to look at how tens and ones (units) work.



The children will continue to follow the 'Come and See' programme as part of their Catholic faith. Topics covered this term will include;

Good News

Learning about the happy part of the Easter story and how we can be like Jesus in our own lives. Finding out about what happened at Pentecost.

Friends

Working with the children on friendships and the importance of forgiveness. Showing how saying sorry (and meaning it) helps in relationships.

Our World

In this topic we learn all about how our wonderful world was created and how through our Laudato Si Mission we should help to look after the world and everything in it. That no matter how small we are we can do things that will help to make a difference to everyone.






We have been reading some fantastic stories in Reception and the children are getting really good at retelling them.
