What a year we've had so far... In the last term we will still have lots of new and exciting things to learn about including the Savage Saxons, Vicious Vikings and how to read Little Red Riding Hood in French! Our Geography topic will be exploring our home town of MIddlesbrough and we will look at what famous foods began in our home town.

Literacy

- Basic punctuation revision to ensure thorough understanding and consistency in use
- We will be looking at narrative writing from the same author-Anthony Brown.
- The children will be wiring instructions on how to make a Vicing Longboat.
- Finally, we will look at List poems.

Maths

- Identify, add and subtract money amounts and solve problems.
- Read and interpret charts and graphs through statistics.
- To recognise, find and write fractions.
- To tell the time to the exact minute.

Science

'Amazing plants' and 'What is light?'

- The children will identify, label and draw parts of the flowering plant.
 They will know how plants reproduce and what functions each part play.
- The children will learn what light is and how we see.

RE

We will begin our summer term looking at the importance of giving to others. We will then look at how our choices have an impact on others and we will end the year with what special places are. We will be making links to biblical stories and asking questions that we wonder about.






