

# Reading

## Word reading

- Recognise 40+ sounds in Read, Write Inc.
- Use my Read, Write Inc. sounds to segment and blend unfamiliar words.
- Read aloud with fluency.
- Read words with apostrophes.
- Read most Y1 common exception words.

## Attitudes and responses

- Recognise and join in with predictable phrases.
- Relate reading to own experiences.
- Re-tell with considerable accuracy.

## Comprehension

- Re-read if reading does not make sense.
- Discuss significance of title and events.
- Make predictions on basis of what has been read.
- Make inferences on basis of what is being said and done.
- Explain texts that I have read or what has been read to me.



# Writing

- Write simple sentences with finger spaces between my words.
- Use 'and' to join ideas.
- Write a sequence of sentences to form a short narrative.
- Read and talk about what I have written.
- Use:
  - capital letters
  - full stops
  - question marks
  - exclamation marks
- Use capital letters for names and personal pronoun 'I'.
- Write Year 1 common exception words and days of the week.
- Form all letters (including capital letters) and numbers correctly.



## Mathematics

- Count to and across 100, forwards & backwards from any number.
- Read and write numbers to 20 in numerals & words.
- Read and write numbers to 100 in numerals.
- Say 1 more/1 less to 100.
- Count in multiples of 2, 5 & 10.
- Use addition and subtraction facts to 20.
- Add & subtract:
  - 1 digit & 2 digit numbers to 20, including zero.
- Solve one-step multiplication and division using objects, pictorial representation and arrays.
- Recognise half and quarter of object, shape or quantity.
- Sequence events in chronological order.
- Use language of day, week, month and year.
- Recognise the value of notes and coins.
- Tell time to hour & half past.
- To recognize and name 2D and 3D shapes.
