Illness and absence -COVID19 Guidance

We are aware that anxiety is high at the moment and our greatest priority is keeping our school family safe. If your child has COVID symptoms-high temperature, persistent cough, change to taste/smell-they should not be brought to school and you must arrange a test for them by ringing 119 and inform school of the test results.

If a member of your family support bubble is being tested after developing symptoms all family members must self isolate until the test result is known. If the test is negative the child can come back into school immediately.

Please note, at this time of year colds are common place. If your child has cold symptoms but not a high temperature (or other COVID symptoms) they are fine to be in school. Your child's education is vital and we expect children to come to school everyday.

On Friday 9th October, we will be participating in #HelloYellow to support the charity, YoungMinds.

Our mental wellbeing has never been more important.

Children will be asked to wear something yellow on this day (socks, tie, bobbles, jumper etc) and donate £1. Due to current restrictions, please can we ask for all donations to be made online, using the link on our Facebook page.



Homework/Google Classroom

Thank you for your ongoing support with online homework and Google Class-

Our Year 6 children have created some wonderful 'how to' videos to help everyone use Google Classroom at home. Check the videos out on our school website under the 'Parents & Students' tab.

We have also purchased CGP books for maths and grammar which you can keep at home and work through weekly as directed by your child's class teacher.

In the event of a bubble closure or a child needing to self isolate lessons will be set on Google Classroom and we would expect children at home to engage with these daily lessons.
