


Advent-a time for getting ready

In December 1987 the first 25 hampers from the CAUSE Christmas Hamper Campaign were delivered.

One of our new school governors and founder, Pat McBride, tells how it all began; "

The inspiration for what I and so many others now do was a pastoral council meeting when a young mother called Carol spoke about the impact of her husband being unemployed. She told us how they had sunk into depths of despair but had been lifted out of it by acts of kindness and love. That year I worked with pupils at New-

lands School, where I was teaching, and got together 25 hampers."

What makes the CAUSE Christmas Hamper Campaign so unique is that although the families remain anonymous, the family dynamics are passed on to those who prepare the hamper which allows it to be personalised to the needs of that particular family.

The Hamper Campaign is now active in over <u>22 schools across Teesside</u> with this number rising annually as past pupils introduce it into their schools, workplaces and homes.

This year we are collecting for 7 families across Teesside; each year group has been assigned a family. We are collecting gifts and food to help make a family's Christmas better.
