RE

Our first topic this term is 'Myself'. We focus on what makes us precious and that God loves each of us.

We then move onto our next topic 'Welcome'. During this topic we focus on being welcomed into the church.

PE

The children are trying very hard to dress and undress themselves. Please help them develop their independence by allowing them to do this at home too.

Maths

During the Autumn Term we focus on pairs, grouping objects by simple properties and we use the Mastery approach to look at numbers within 10. We also use Numberblocks to support our learning.



Writing

Writing takes many forms in Reception. We have started trying to write our full name. As well as writing sessions, there are plenty of opportunities to write in all areas of our provision. We practise our fine motor skills throughout the day too.

Phonics

In Reception, we are following the Little Wandle Revised Letters & Sounds phonics scheme. There will be an information meeting on Wednesday 22nd September at 3pm for you to learn more about this scheme and how we teach children to read.



Reading

Your child will shortly begin bringing books home. There will be one for your child to read to you and one for you to read to your child. It is really important that all books are returned to school each week. There will be more information about this during our Phonics information meeting.

The Early Years curriculum is split into 7 areas of learning. Here's what we will be focussing on this term -

Prime Areas

Personal, Social and Emotional Development – Settling in, taking turns, sharing fairly with others, forming good relationships with peers and adults.

Communication and Language – Speaking and listening to each other, sharing ideas, developing questioning words and skills, learning new songs and nursery rhymes.

Physical Development – Exploring and learning in all weathers, using a wide variety of indoor and outdoor equipment to develop fine and gross motor skills.

The four specific areas help children to strengthen and apply the prime areas:

Literacy - Sharing stories, writing our names, labels, games to develop listening skills and beginning the Little Wandle phonics programme.

Mathematics – Sorting using simple properties, matching and pairing, numbers 0-10.

Understanding the world - Learning about ourselves, people who live in Afghanistan, refugees and the world around us, sharing stories and exploring the changes happening as we move into Autumn.

Expressive arts and design – We will be learning about the American artist Alma Thomas and the difficulties she faced growing up as black girl. We will also be encouraging children to be creative and use their own ideas, self-selecting resources, making choices about how to combine parts to create different effects and investigating different textures.

Uniform

Everyone is looking extremely smart in their green St Augustine's uniform! Please make sure your child's name is in **every** item of clothing, coat, shoe etc. We already have lost items.

Snack / Water bottles

School will provide a fruit or veg snack daily.

Water bottles should only contain water. Please no fruit juice, fizzy drinks or flavoured water. We will do a lot of work on looking after our teeth and these drinks have been proven to damage them.

Homework will be set using Google Classroom.
