RE

Maths

During the Spring Term we focus on our number bonds to 5, comparing groups, using the mathematical symbols + and =, balancing, full and empty, capacity and measuring ingredients.



Writin

Writing takes many forms in Reception. We have started trying to use our phonics to help us spell words and using finger spaces to separate our words. As well as writing sessions, there are plenty of opportunities to write in all areas of our provision. We practise our fine motor skills throughout the day too.

Phonics

In Reception, we continue to follow the Little Wandle Revised Letters & Sounds phonics scheme.



Reading

I am sure you are already amazed at how wonderful your child is at reading. I am so proud of the progress they are all making. Please ensure you continue to log onto the Collins website and let your child read the books that have been allocated to them. Your child will shortly begin bringing books home. Please continue to read to your child too. This is so important in their language development and will help to foster a love of reading.

The Early Years curriculum is split into 7 areas of learning. Here's what we will be focussing on this term -

Prime Areas

Personal, Social and Emotional Development – Playing with more than 1 child, resolving conflict by themselves, how to stay healthy and look after themselves.

Communication and Language – Using longer sentences to articulate their ideas, engage in non-fiction books, using connectives to connect one idea to another.

Physical Development – Exploring and learning in all weathers, using a wide variety of indoor and outdoor equipment to develop fine and gross motor skills.

The four specific areas help children to strengthen and apply the prime areas:

Literacy – Reading short phrases and sentences, writing our full name with capital letters, using finger spaces and continuing with the Little Wandle phonics programme.

Mathematics – Number bonds to 5, Comparing quantities, Capacity and Measuring.

Understanding the world – Recognising the planet we live on, phases of the moon, other planets in our solar system, nocturnal animals, recognising some environments which are different to ours.

Expressive arts and design – Create collaboratively sharing ideas, resources and skills, Colour mixing, Moving to music.

Uniform

Snack / Water Bottles

School will provide a fruit or veg snack daily.
