Attendance and Punctuality

You are reminded that school starts at 8:45am for children in Reception, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2. Nursery starts at 8.30am.

Gates are open from 8:30am and are locked again at 8.50am.

Activities and learning begin across school at 8.30am; teachers set up early morning maths/English/handwriting. These early morning activities allow revision of facts and skills essential for 'sticky learning' (improving children's memories).

With all of the potential 'lost learning' children have experienced throughout the pandemic we are trying our very hardest to maximise every minute of time spent in school.

Please continue to support us with our high expectations of attendance; our whole school attendance is currently at 95.1%, this remains below our target of 97%. Please try your hardest to ensure your child attends everyday of school on time.



Uniform

Thank you for continuing to support our school uniform expectations. Children continue to be in full winter uniform; this consists of a white shirt/blouse, school tie, green jumper, grey trousers/skirt/pinafore or checked skirt/pinafore (Year 1-6).

Children should be in black school shoes each day, not trainers, with plain grey/white/green/black socks/tights.

Please note that no jewellery is permitted in school, all earrings must be removed.

We also ask that children do not wear make up or nail varnish for school.

There is an increasing number of children with lines/shapes shaved into their hair; this goes against our expected uniform standards and we ask that parents do not allow these hairstyles in school.

We have noticed how smart most children are on PE uniform days; I know that there were some concerns expressed by a few parents about the impact of wearing PE kits all day in school. We have found the benefits to be huge; children are not wasting time getting changed and we

have much fewer lost items of clothing. Please note PE uniform consists of a white T shirt and plain black/grey/navy/green jogging bottoms/shorts. There is also a PE hoody available to buy from Lollipops. If you need any help with affording uniform please speak to Mrs Rehbohm or another member of the senior leadership team-we often have spare nearly new items available in school.



Mini Vinnies & Chaplaincy

Our KS2 Mini Vinnies and Chaplaincy children have organised our Lent Called to Serve Project. During Lent, we are supporting Cafod's Ukraine Humanitarian Campaign. To support the campaign, we have a Penny Pot appeal where you can donate loose change during Lent. Please send small change 1p. 2p, 5p etc to school and we will forward your donations to Cafod. We are also supporting the work at St Mary's Cathedral. We are asking for **donations of non-perishable foods**. Could you spare a packet of rice, sugar, biscuits, tin of vegetables or fish or even a bottle of cooking oil? You can also **donate toiletries** for the homeless and refugees. If you are able to support those in greater need, please send your items to school during Lent.

The children have organised and delivered our travelling cross bags to each class. These will be sent home each evening to a child in every class: we hope you enjoy sharing the Easter message with your family. They have also set up beautiful prayer spaces in our chapel to support and inspire prayer and quiet reflection in school during this special time.
