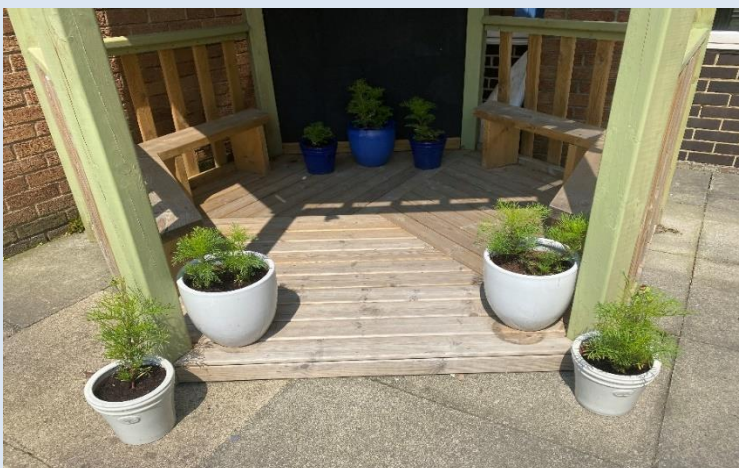

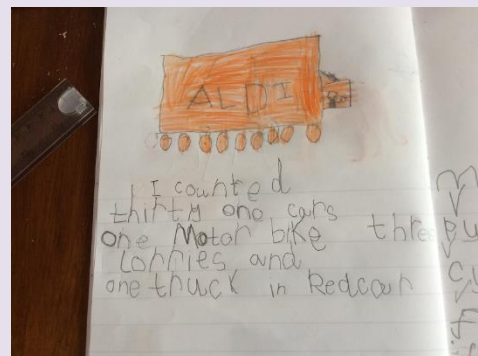


RECEPTION

The people lick their lips - and then eat fish and chips

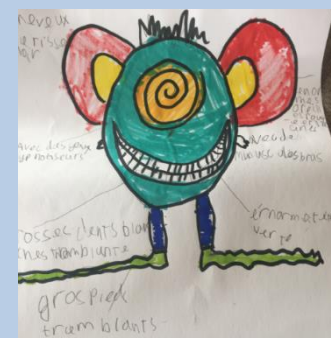
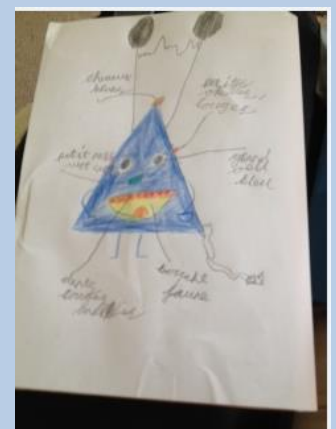
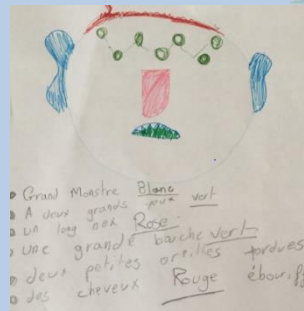
I walked in Saltburn and had an ice cream - The taste was beyond my wildest dream

YEAR 5

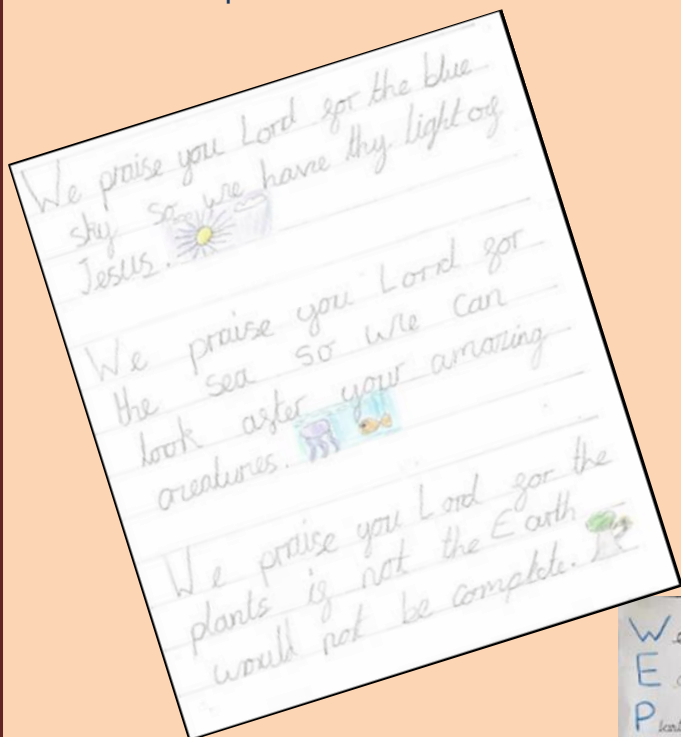
