

Intended Actions (2024-25)

What are your plans for 2024/25?	How are you going to action and achieve these plans?
Intent	Implementation
Continue to develop Teaching and Learning PowerPoints and provide support for teachers to use these in their teaching. Allow CPD to discuss task design and ideas to ensure children's knowledge and vocabulary is strengthened.	CPD to be planned in Autumn Term to provide updates around using the Teaching and Learning Model in PE. From this, offer support sessions where teachers can visit to receive support with their planning. Utilise support from NPCAT (Jake Lance & Clare Harding) to provide further support for teachers to ensure children are receiving high quality PE. In Spring & Summer term, Pupil voice and monitoring to be completed. Create a shared drive where teachers can share Good Practice of Teaching Slides where strategies for promoting Teaching & Learning have been used.



Incorporate a focus on assessment in PE, using staff meeting time to provide teachers with support on how to do this effectively. Introduce the PE Passport Updates using 'Know, Show. Grow' as learning objectives and a tool to assess children in all areas of PE. From this, target groups can be identified from PE Passport Assessment.	CPD to be planned in Autumn Term to explain how to assess children using the PE Passport and 'Know, Show, Grow' objectives. Support Drop-in Sessions to be offered at the week a topic is ending. From this, Gifted and Talented Children can be identified and extracurricular opportunities can be provided and more focus around preparing for competitions.
Consider ways that oracy can be incorporated in to PE and provide support through CPD for teachers to understand and be confident to create environments that create these opportunities for oracy.	CPD to be planned in Autumn Term to provide updates around using areas such as cold calling and think pair share can be used in PE. Offer teacher drop ins so they can see this being used within the classrooms. Create a shared drive where teachers can share Good Practice of Teaching Slides where opportunities for oracy can be used.
Ensure that there is a refocus on STRIVE. Children will become confident in naming the values linked to STRIVE and can articulate why they are important to PE & School Sport. These values will be celebrated within PE Lessons.	Self-Belief Teamwork Resilience Integrity Virtuous Equality Children develop a knowledge and understanding of STRIVE, what that means and how they can show it through PE and School Sport. They will understand how this can transfer across subjects and into their whole lives. A certificate slide will be added to the end of PE Lessons and this time should be taken to celebrate a child who has shown an area of STRIVE. Discussions can take place within the class about how this was achieved.
Children's accomplishments with PE & Physical activity both in school and out of school will be celebrated.	Parents to be sent email address to send any accomplishments outside of school. Certificates/Medals to be purchased to celebrate in school achievements both in the class and whole school in assemblies. Social Media to be regularly updated showcases PE Lessons, extracurricular opportunities and

St Benedict's to be present in NPCAT Sport Competitions. In addition to this, there will be further competitions offered for children to participate in.	Use of SH Minibus will allow St Benedict's to take teams to NPCAT Competitions. In addition to this, the access to transport can be used to take groups of children to local schools for cluster games, allowing children who didn't go to the competitions chance to experience competitions (use of NPCAT Sports Coaches to Support this).
	To celebrate the end of topics within PE, Intra House competitions can be ran to ensure all children can incorporate the skills they have learnt in the topic in to a competitive environment.
	Sports Leaders to provide lunchtime competitions that follow the same pattern and structure as NPCAT Competition.
Utilise the use of Staff, Sports Leaders and Extra-Curricular clubs to ensure there is always an opportunity for children to experience PE & Sport.	Across the year, clubs will be offered before school, during lunchtimes and after schools. Sports Leaders will plan and deliver clubs with Mr Sturdy & Jake Lance overseeing these.
	Extra curricular clubs will be utilised such as Urban Kaos, Golf Fore All, W2 Academy, Ormesby Table Tennis, Wheelchair Basketball.



Provide opportunities for children to access sporting events in the local community (Redcar Athletic, Middlesbrough Football Club, Teesside Lions etc).	Aim to organise at least one trip to a sporting event that children and parents can come along to. Offer tickets to sporting events as incentive/rewards for those who continuously show STRIVE.
Continue to use sport as a driver for the whole school community and Charity. Link sport to the Catholic Ethos of the school as a tool to raise money and support local charities.	Continue to work with charities to develop sporting events/challenges where children can raise money. Sports Leaders to run a club in summer term for both children/parents/teachers.
Refresh of equipment to ensure children have access to equipment needed for high quality PE.	Complete Audit of Current PE & Sport Equipment to ensure equipment is available and safe for teachers. From this, replenish and replace any equipment. Ensure Sports Leader tops & NPCAT Competition Tops are replenished.
Sport Leaders to achieve at least the NPCAT Platinum Award. This will enable them to work hard across the year to support the development of sport within the school.	Sports Leaders work closely with NPCAT Sports Coach to plan, prepare and deliver clubs, competitions and other opportunities for children to participate in PE & School Sport. Sports Leaders to create a link with other school's sports leaders to come up with further ideas and opportunities between NPCAT Schools.
Investigate ways that children can learn about other areas within sport, such as Sports Analysis and Sports Science.	Look into local universities and performance centres and see if there are opportunities. During careers week, see if any athletes/people who work within sport are able to come in and speak to the children about the importance of their jobs in sport.

Intent	Implementation
Teachers to become confident in using the Teaching & Learning Model in PE. By sharing Powerpoints in a shared drive folder, teachers will be able to share ideas with each other. N Sturdy can monitor these and provide support if needed. Children will become more able to recall skills, vocabulary and information from PE lessons and will be able to articulate why they have been taught this, how it impacts on their PE & Exercise.	Pupil voice to be completed in both Spring and Summer terms. Lesson monitoring by N Sturdy & C Harding. PowerPoints in Shared Drive to be monitored.
Teachers become able and confident to assess children accurately. Target groups will become evident from assessment and teachers can make adaptations to lessons so that children can focus on areas the teachers notice need it.	PE Passport to record all assessments from Autumn 2 through to the summer.



Children are provided with more opportunities to use oracy to discuss areas within PE. They will have the opportunity to share ideas and use vocabulary learnt with their peers. Constructive feedback within lessons will become normal to the children and they will use their knowledge to support their peers.	Use of Teaching & Learning Model Slides. Sharing of good practice.
Children are able to articulate what STRIVE Stands for and the effect it has on PE & School Sport. They should model these areas within PE and think of ways that they can show each strand of STRIVE within lessons.
