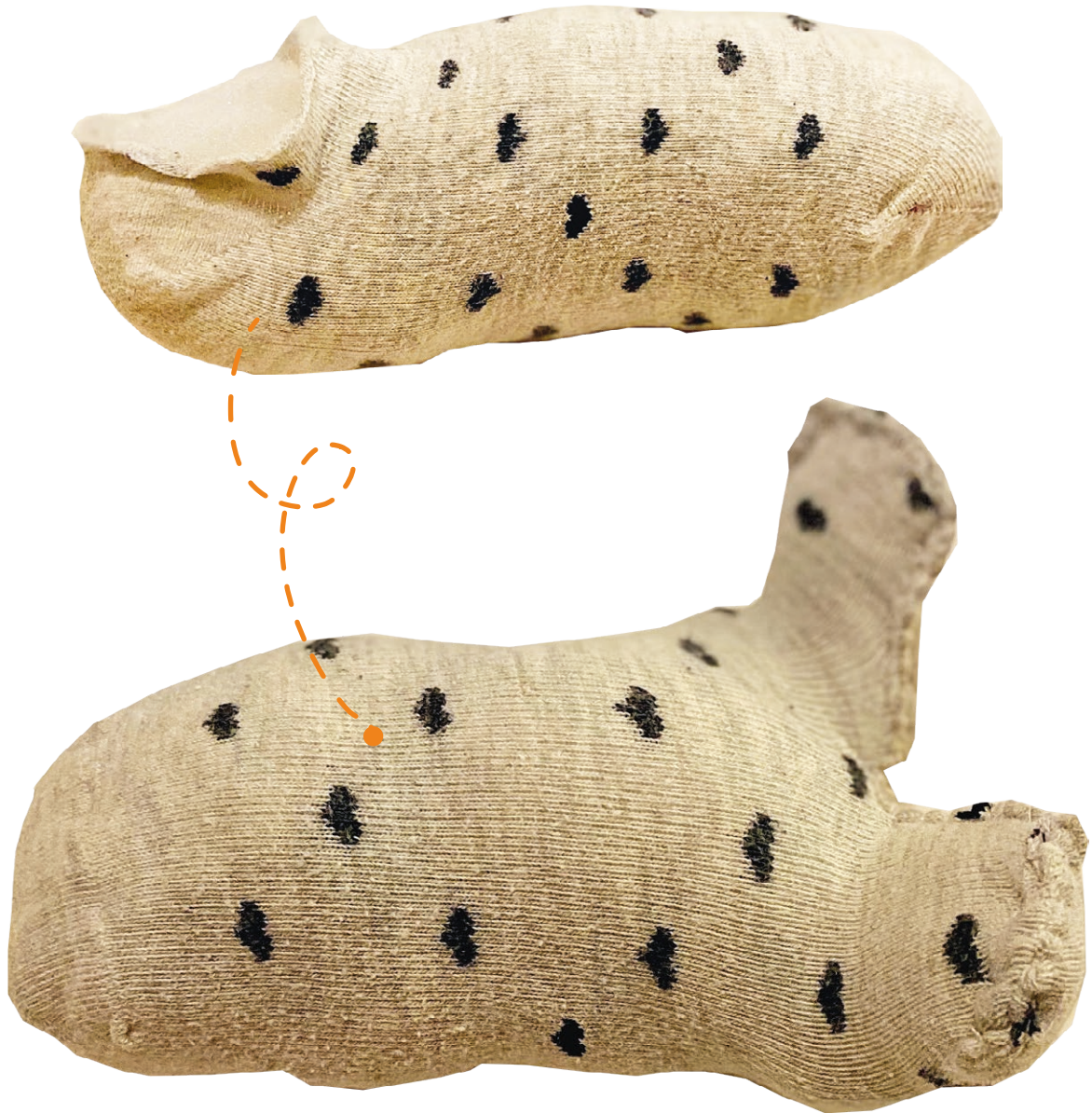


Easter Sock Rabbit

You Will Need:

- A pair of socks
- 2 buttons
- Scissors
- A needle and thread
- Cotton wool or similar, for padding





Step 1: The Body

Turn one of the socks inside out and then cut off the open end a few centimetres above the heel. Keep the remaining ankle section aside for the ears.

Cut a line in the centre of the open end of the sock through the heel. Then, stuff the body with cotton wool or similar, and sew around the edges to make the feet.



Step 2: The Head

Stuff the toe end of the other sock until you are able to form a ball. Cut the end off, leaving a few centimetres spare. Then, sew a line across the open end to create the head.



Step 3: The Ears

Take the ankle section from the first sock and cut it in half lengthwise. Then, use your scissors to round off the edges and sew them together to form the ears.



**Step 4:
Putting It
All Together**

Sew the ears to the head and the head to the body. You have your Easter rabbit!



Step 4: Finishing Touches

Now, take your buttons and sew them to either side of the rabbit's head to make eyes. If you pull the thread right through the head section, it shapes the face in a more realistic manner.

After this, bundle up your remaining cotton wool or other padding and sew it on the back of the body to form a tail.

To add arms, sew a line through either side of the rabbit's body.

If you want, you can wrap a hairband or a bit of wool around their neck for a seasonal spring scarf!
