

## Year 5

This week in Year 5 we have continued with our Ancient Egyptian theme through our History and English: we have been planning and writing stories based on a short video clip and learning more about how the Ancient Egyptians lived. We have also begun researching designs for a shaduf (an Egyptian farming tool for watering crops) as part of our DT project. In maths, we have been recapping on multiplication strategies and applying this to problem solving. In Science, we have introduced our final topic of the year, Animals including Humans. In lesson 1, we focussed on the human life cycle in more depth. In RE, we have continued with our Freedom and Responsibility topic. We have been learning about the story of the Israelites' journey from Egypt to the Promised Land and the story of the Ten Commandments. For Computing, we have continued with coding using Purple Mash. Remember to check into Spelling Shed each week as your weekly spellings are there for you to practise and continue with Times Tables Rock Stars too. The teachers are setting up challenges every week.

## Year 3/4

This week Year 3/4 have enjoyed more of the 'Hodgeheg' story. We have been using this book to develop our inference skills as well as using speech verbs, adverbs and descriptive language. In maths we are revisiting and developing our calculation strategies adding 1's, 10's and 100's.

We have begun our new RE topic building bridges this week, a topic which will help us to have a deeper understanding of forgiveness and the sacrament of reconciliation.

We have enjoyed using BBC online learning activities for mapping skills in geography.

Our children continue to amaze us with the quality of work and dedication to their learning each day. We are very proud of them.



# Year 2

Well done Year Two we have had another wonderful week of learning. This week we have finished our final novel by Dick King Smith and the children have completed Book Reviews to give their opinions. It is clear to see that the children have really enjoyed all his books we have read. In Maths we have now come to the end of our unit on Number and Place Value where this week we have focussed on combining different amounts of money and problem solving. The children have explored food chains in their Science work and have created their own food chains, identifying consumers, predators and prey. The children have thoroughly enjoyed using a jungle painting by Henri Rousseau as inspiration for their own artwork.



## Year 1

In Year 1 this week the children have enjoyed reading and comparing the two stories 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff and 'The Three Billy Dogs Gruff' in our English lessons. They found the similarities and differences between the two stories and used our letter writing skills to write to the crocodile asking him to let the dogs cross the river safely. They have also been working hard to identify alternative pronunciations in our Phonics lessons. In maths this week, the children have been learning about length and measure. They have enjoyed using non-standard measures, like our hands to measure and compare the length of different objects. They have also put all their family members in order of height!

This week on the Google Classroom, we have been marvelled by all your amazing work and have enjoyed seeing all the great activities you have been enjoying at home. Thank you for sharing these experiences with everyone, we are so proud of you all!







# Reception

This week in Reception, we have read the story Starr-Eyed Stan who was a starfish that liked to sing! The children discussed how he worked with his friends as a team to send a nasty crab away. The children then wrote a sentence describing what happened in the story and drew beautiful pictures. We have practised some tricky words, our handwriting and how to spell some decodable words. We have then learnt our number bonds to ten and practised writing our numbers correctly. We have even learnt some Samba dance moves put them together to make a Samba routine.
