School staff have increased their confidence and competence with using PE Passport and the teaching and learning within PE is more consistent across school. NPCAT Sport continues to provide ongoing, high quality CPD including a team teaching approach for PE lessons. All pupils have attended competitions and events run by both NPCAT Sport which has broadened the range of opportunities and experiences for the children. Secured Silver NPCAT Trust Mark Award. Attended NPCAT Annual Sports Awards and two Y6 pupils received Sports Personality of the Year. NPCAT Sport provided training for Sports Leaders to organise and deliver more sport and physical activity opportunities. A clear vision and mission for PESSPA at St Edward's was developed with a clear focus 	 Children are building their knowledge and skills as a result of the improved teaching and learning in PE. Children are given more opportunities to also develop their strategic knowledge, such as attacking and defending skills and apply these in a range of sports.
