Personal, Social & Emotional Development

Can take-turns, wait and share resources with one child.

Can listen to and increasingly follow rules.

Can be increasingly independent in accessing the setting.

Can begin to talk about their feelings.

Can begin to be aware of others' feelings and choices.

Can be more confident with using the toilet, putting own coat on and washing hands and can ask for help if needed.

Can explore a range of healthy foods and make good choices.

Early Reading

Can begin to use and express their vocabulary through different experiences.

Can begin to respond to questions appropriately.

Can listen to and follow instructions.

Can sing songs and learn new rhymes.

Can begin to identify letters in their name.

Can begin to retell familiar stories.

Can begin to explore initial phonemes in familiar words.



Early Maths

Can join in with counting rhymes and songs.

Can react to changes of amount in a group of up to three items.

Can count objects to three accurately and to Know that the last number reached is the total.

Can begin to explore 2D & 3D shapes.

Can begin to compare quantities, size, length, weight and capacity in everyday play.

Can copy and create simple patterns.

Can explore different positions with objects.

Can begin to subitise small amounts.

Early Writing

Can begin to trace, copy and form some letters correctly from their name.

Can use shoulder and elbow pivots to create lines and circles and use hands, wrists and fingers during fine-motor activities.

Can begin to develop confidence and more control using mark-making resources, developing a comfortal

Can begin to use scissors independently to snip and cut along straight lines.

Can begin to draw recognisable figures with increasing detail.
