### **English**



"The more that you read, the more things you will know. The more that you learn, the more places you'll go." Dr Seuss

This term, we will be using CUSP curriculum to inform our Reading and Writing. We will be studying the following texts as part of our reading foci: I am not a label and Boy in the Tower.

In writing, we will be studying a range of genres, including: Third person stories set in another culture, playscripts, balanced argument, poems that use play on words and a diary entry.

The National Curriculum has a particular focus on spelling, punctuation and grammar so this will continue to be integrated into all of our lessons. Children will receive a set of spellings to learn weekly, which will consist of the spelling rules we are focusing on that week and words from the new statutory word lists. we will be revising the words from the year 5 and 6 statutory lists and continue to consolidate spellings from the Year 3 and 4 statutory words for any children who may need further revision.

Children who read at home frequently produce work of a higher standard in English; therefore we encourage them to do this on a daily basis for at least 15 minutes. Please support them with this by encouraging reading at home. Sign your child's reading record and ensure it is returned to school each day.

### Science

This term, in Science, we will be focus on 'The human body.'

- 1. Life Cycles of Plants and Animals in our Local Area
- 2. Reproduction in Plants
- 3. Life Cycles of Mammals and Amphibians
- 4. Life Cycles of Insects and Birds
- 5. The Work of David Attenborough and Jane Goodall

We will then focus on 'Materials.'

- 1. Forces Including Gravity
- 2. Air Resistance, Water Resistance and Friction
- 3/4. Investigation: Paper Drop
- 5. Pulleys, Gears and Levers

### Maths



This term, we will continue to build on the skills learned last term, using formal methods for all four operations.

This term, our main areas of study will be:

Multiplication and division, fractions, decimals and percentages, perimeter and area and statistics.

The children will apply these skills and concepts in regular arithmetic activities as well as developing the application of these skills in real-life problems. Children will also develop their reasoning skills, explaining their answers and methods.

According to the curriculum, all children should know their tables up to 12x12. We would encourage all children to practise regularly to increase confidence, accuracy and fluency. Times Tables Rockstars is a fantastic programme to support pupils at home with this. All Year 5 pupils have been given a log in to access this.

### RF

Spring term begins with the topic of <u>Mission</u>. This is where we look at what is our calling and how can we live this out

In <u>Memorial Sacrifice</u>, children will explore how we can keep our memories alive.

In the topic of <u>Sacrifice</u>, the children will explore and understand that we can all make different sacrifices and how that can affect our lives during Lent. We pay particular attention to the different masses held around Easter.

### Art and D.T.

This term, we will look at Art from Western Africa This unit explores the art of Western Africa by looking at Malian antelope headdresses and the Benin plaques from Nigeria. The children learn about how the Malian headdresses, made by the Bamana peoples are used in a ceremony to honour the spirt Chiwara and reflects the importance of farming in their rural community. The children explore how the shapes in the headdress represent different animals important in Bamana society. The children then study Chinese ceramics, at first investigating Ming Dynasty porcelain, how this was made and decorated with cobalt blue. They then learn how the Chinese traded porcelain with Europe, the Portuguese and then the Dutch, until the trade diminished in the early 1700s when the Europeans started to make porcelain themselves.

In D.T. this term, our topic is Build. The children will be researching, designing, making and evaluating  $\it Cam Toys$ .
