We departed Manchester for Milan in the early hours of Sunday and arrived in Bormio after a long journey to be greeted by sunny skies and plenty of snow on the slopes of the Italian Alps.

The next day the group were ready for their first lessons. Despite some nerves, all the pupils quickly got to grips with the skis, boots and their debuts on the slopes.

They skied for five hours per day for five days and the progress they made was amazing, with all the pupils showing real resilience and determination.

Throughout the week we enjoyed excellent après ski activities such as an open air disco in Bormio square,

Our final day saw us visit the lake and some more time for some sightseeing in the town. It was a wonderful trip, with exemplary behaviour from our pupils, who represented the school in such a wonderful manner. The next ski trip is already being researched for 2022.
