Who is it for?

Good Classroom Teachers who are practising Catholics who currently teach in another subject area who would like the challenge and reward that comes with being an RE teacher in a Catholic school

What does it involve?

- Diocesan led knowledge and skills training
- School led mentoring, planning and preparation support
- University accredited module (30 Masters Credits) on researching and planning lessons

Who is it delivered by?

A team of experienced Directors of Education, Deputy heads, Assistant Heads and RE leads of Outstanding schools from across the dioceses as well as Lecturers from Leeds Trinity University

What are the expectations?

A timetable of at least one key stage 3 class in the training year and the opportunity to team teach KS4

An appointed mentor either in school or from the Diocesan Hub

- 4 full days of training
- 4 online sessions on subject specific content
- A portfolio of evidence
- Completion of an online module with Leeds Trinity University

How long does it take?

The course take place over one academic year
