Reading

The Nicene Creed: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. Prayer: We pray every day in school. It is a way to communicate with God. Give thanks as well as ask for help. The whole of our school community takes part in prayer, regardless of faith. If in doubt ask your teacher or Mrs Fisk for help. We start and end with the Sign of the Cross.

Church: The place of prayer and worship. Christians will celebrate festivals and Mass at Church. Other religions have different names for their places of worship (Muslims-Mosque, Sikhs- Gurdwara, Hindu- Mandir, Jewish- Synagogue, Buddhist- Vihara) Our place of prayer within school is called the chapel. It's like a 'mini church'.

Collective Worship: You will be expected to help plan and take part in collective worship in St Patrick's. You will get help from your teachers and Mrs Fisk along the way. It is a wonderful opportunity to pray and reflect on certain topics (e.g. Anti-bullying) or readings (e.g. 'Love is patient, love is kind')

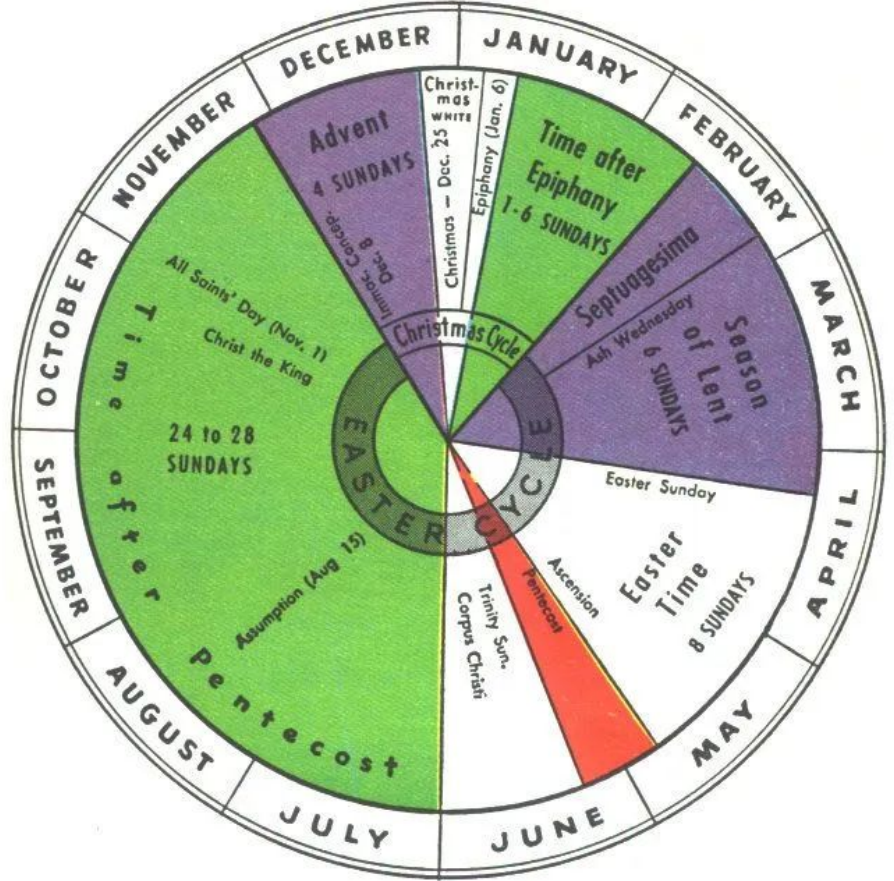
Charity and Community: We are part of our school and local community. As members of a Catholic school, we take part in charity work. It is our duty to help others. It is our duty to be kind. "Love thy neighbour".

Festivals: We celebrate lots of festivals throughout the year. We follow the Catholic Church Year (the Liturgical Year). So, you will see colours change depending on our Catholic season (e.g. Lent is purple). Christmas and Easter are our most important times. Advent is the season leading up to when we celebrate the birth of Jesus; Christmas. Whereas Lent is the season leading up to when we celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus; Easter.

Ecumenism: Different Churches working together.

Tabernacle: The place in a church where the blessed sacrament is kept (the bread and wine when they have been blessed)

Transubstantiation: The belief that Holy Communion is the real presence of Christ. Not just symbolic.

Vocation: A calling given to us by God. Everyone has a vocation. Our gifts and talents are often clues.

Trinity: The Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Three in One.
