Key word	Definition
Holy Spirit	The third person of the Trinity; God spiritually active in the world.
Pentecost	A Christian festival; when the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples.
Ruach	The Hebrew word for "breath of life", or "spirit of God".
People of God	The whole Christian community who come together as the Church.
Body of Christ	A mystical union of all Christians in one spiritual body with Jesus as the head.
Confirmation	One of the sacraments; becoming a full member of the Church.
Temple of the Holy Spirit	Through the Holy Spirit each Christian becomes a Temple.
Fruits of the Spirit	Behaviours and attitudes shown by people filled with the Holy Spirit eg joy and kindness

The Nature of God: We can use our thoughts, books, the Church and prayers to try and work out what God is really like. We know God is all powerful because He created everything. We know He is all loving because He sent His only Son to die for our sins.

Sin and Salvation: When we deliberately turn against God, we sin. Jesus took our sins with Him on the cross. We are saved by His sacrifice. This is Salvation.

Atonement: making up for our sins. E.g. this could be through saying the Rosary.

Judgement: At the end of time God will judge everyone based on what we have and have not done.

Evangelisation: Spreading the Word of God.

Catechism, Church and the Bible: The Catechism is a book of Catholic beliefs. The Church isn't a building, it's the Catholics. These are different ways we can find out what is right and wrong.

Vocation: A calling given to us by God. Everyone has a vocation. Our gifts and talents are often clues.

Philosophy: A fantastic subject to explore. Asking deep and profound questions. For example, does God exist? What is the meaning of life? How do we know we are real?

Take Action: Laudato Si: Pope Francis wrote Laudato Si. Read it. Go on the CAFOD website to learn more about it. More importantly, do something to help the environment.

RE: Qualifications and Careers: The skills acquired in RE are incredibly important within our society. Any job views these skills as desirable.
