The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)


- The EYFS (Early years foundation stage) comprises of nursery and reception
- We have a 78 place nursery and class 1 reception class and class 2 reception/Y1
- Nursery Mrs Kennedy, Mrs Cassidy, Mrs McNamee & Miss Matthews
- Class 1 Miss Ward, Mrs Jackson & Miss Wardell
- Class 2 Miss Newby & Miss Thompson

The curriculum

- ► The EYFS follows the 'Development matters' curriculum
- ► This is made up of 17 areas of learning and progression is from the age of 0 -11 months up to 40-60 months, then onto achieving an Early Learning Goal (ELG)

RE 'Talking to God'

- RE is an integral part of our curriculum
- RE teaching follows the 'Come and see' curriculum
- Collective worship in class and EYFS phase each week
- Children will say daily prayers and PSED curriculum is closely linked to RE

Areas of learning

- Your child is assessed every term against the learning objectives in each of the areas of learning.
- In each age band your child will be given a level of development
 - Emerging
 - Expected
 - Exceeding

Exit Profile

You will be given an exit profile report at the end of nursery and reception and you will be told which age band your child is in for each area of learning and whether they are emerging, expected or exceeding in these areas

TRANSITION

- When the children return to school in September your child will return to nursery until Monday 14th September.
- Your child will return to the original nursery session they were in before lockdown. This will only be for 2 weeks.
- For those children starting our school from other settings a member of staff will be in touch to discuss preferred session.
- This will give staff the opportunity and time to settle the children back into nursery and school routine. The children will meet their new teachers and friends, have a school dinner and spend time in their new classroom.
- On Monday 14th September your child will make the transition into full time reception.
- Please speak to a member of staff if you have any concerns.

FIRST DAY AT SCHOOL

- School times for reception children will be 8.40-2.55
- On your child's first day at school bring them the door outside of class 2
- A member of the Reception staff will be there to welcome them
- They will take your child into their classroom and they will be shown where to put all of their belongings
- Your child will not need to bring a snack to school, each Reception child receives a piece of fruit for a snack each day and a drink of milk.
- They will need to bring a water bottle each day.
- You can then collect them at 2.55 from outside the door of class 1 or class 2

UNIFORM

- Uniform for September 2020
- Grey trousers/skirt/pinafore (available from most supermarkets and shops)
- White shirt/polo shirt/blouse (available from most supermarkets and shops)
- Green v neck jumper with school badge (from motif 8)
- School string tie (from motif 8)
- Black shoes
- Girls hair tied neatly back where possible and sensible haircut for boys
- No earrings or jewellery allowed in school

PE KIT

- Bring PE kit in a backpack on a Monday and leave in school until Friday

- Please help your child to get dressed and undressed independently to help them when it is time to change for PE








BOOK BAGS

- Your child will need a book bag/reading packet for school everyday
- They will have a reading book and key words to read each night
- Please support your child by listening them to read each night and write a comment in their reading record book

Every Reception and Key Stage One child is entitled to a free school meal



- Your child will have a choice of 2 hot meals and 1 cold meal
- They will choose their meal at register time each morning
- Reception children go into the dinner hall first and are supported by teachers and lunch time supervisors
- If your child is not eating their school meal you will be informed
- Information about school meals can be found on our school website.

- If you intend to give your child a packed lunch they will eat with children on a packed lunch too
- A packed lunch needs to have:
- A sandwich/wrap/pasta
- A yoghurt
- A piece of fruit
- A treat e.g. Chocolate biscuit or cake
- Crisps are only allowed on a Friday

- Your child will be given water at their dinner table
- No drinks are needed in a packed lunch and no sweets or large chocolate bars
- ► Each child needs to bring a water bottle (labelled with their name) to school each day to leave in their classroom and they can have a drink when they need one.

ILLNESSES

- If your child is unwell please call school on the morning to let us know that your child will be absent
- If you are unsure whether to send them to school send them to school and we can contact you if they become more unwell
- For diarrhoea and sickness your child should stay away from school for 48 hours

MEDICAL CONDITIONS

- Nursery will pass on details of any existing medical conditions to new teachers
- Please have an inhaler to leave in school for children with asthma
- Any new food allergies and medical conditions please let a member of staff know as soon as possible

HOLIDAYS

- School are not permitted to allow any holidays in term time (only exceptional circumstances)

BREAKFAST AND AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS

Please speak to a member of staff if you would like your child to attend breakfast or after school clubs and they will discuss availability and costs.
