<p style="text-align: center;">English</p> <p>This term, we will look at Blitz poetry and think about the impact of words and how we can create imagery in our writing. We will move on to look at and watch nature documentaries and narratives to learn how to use Year 6 features of writing to engage the reader, whilst writing in the style of the legend, David Attenborough. In the second half term, we will discuss our favourite authors and creatively write letters to them in the hope of receiving a reply. In our reading sessions we will continue to focus on new vocabulary and how to use contextual clues to work out the meaning of unknown words. We will also practise and improve our summarising, retrieval, prediction and inferencing skills.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Maths</p> <p>To make sure that we are ready for secondary school, we will continue to practise arithmetic regularly using the four operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Times tables tests will take place each Friday which will be part of your child's homework. Please support your child in learning all of their times tables – a secure knowledge will make KS2 maths much easier! We will continue to follow White Rose Maths which involves problem solving and some greater -depth thinking. Times tables and mental arithmetic will be practised daily to improve our rapid recall skills.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Science</p> <p>This term, we will study 'Light'. We will carry out many practical investigations to see how we can change shadows. We will explore how our eyes allow us to see as well as investigating the difference between reflection and refraction. How can a rainbow coloured wheel turn white when it is spun? The second half of this term will have an eco-focus whereby we look at the wonderful world of bees and how important they are to the environment.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">RE</p> <p>The focus of this term's RE work is 'Witnesses' and 'Healing'. Children will learn the courage needed to be a witness and how Pentecost and the Holy Spirit enables people to witness the Easter message. During the second half-term, we will look at 'Healing' and the Sacrament of the Anointing of the sick. We will also look at how the Church is called to the stewardship of creation and how Christians can work towards justice for all.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">PE</p> <p>Tennis – The first half term will be a chance to learn some new tennis skills. We will learn how to control a racket, the co-ordination needed to hit a ball and the skills needed to move around a tennis court. Athletics -This term the focus will be on developing the technical understanding of athletic activities. Setting own targets and improving personal best in terms of sprinting, throwing, etc. will help to build up stamina and be more precise and efficient with movement. Lessons are brilliantly delivered by Mr Poole or Mr Mills, our expert PE coaches. PE is on a Friday so remember to have PE Kits in school (White tops/black shorts and trainers).</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Computing</p> <p>In the first half-term we will be looking at how games are made and the computer coding behind them. We will learn how to use programs like Scratch to create our own games. In the second half term we will be using programming to create a loop. We will be testing to see if computers will do what we tell them to do. It will take a lot of debugging and testing of the process. We are hoping to be able to use our new 3D printer to create our own models linked to DT work as well!</p>

French

Les Vêtements – (Clothes) Children will learn how to say what they are wearing using adjectives to describe in more detail. They will begin to understand and apply grammar rules such as noun-adjective agreement depending on whether a noun is feminine or masculine. They will continue to practise speaking and listening skills to an audience. During the second half-term, children will consolidate what they have learnt in secondary school by creating their own French book. This project will enable them to apply their creative skills whilst also requiring sound knowledge of their chosen topic. The children will then read their book to a chosen audience from KS1.

Art and D&T

Art- In this topic, the children will explore the art of 'Volendam Landschappen' – landscapes from Holland! We will practise drawing in perspective and making our artwork focus on one point. We will improve our sketching skills and think about how we can make our drawings lifelike.

Design & Technology – In our food we will be spreading joy, making muffins, biscuits or fairy cakes for the elderly and housebound in our community. We will learn how to use an oven to cook food and gain an understanding of how a vegetarian and vegan maintains a healthy diet. Children will learn techniques such as chopping, peeling, grating, slicing, mixing, spreading, kneading and baking.

History

In our history lessons we will be going way back in time to look at ancient civilisation. We will be studying the Ancient Sumer people and how they lived. Some of the things that we will look at include how they used farming to grow their food and how the Sumer people were the inventors of many things! As part of our Geography learning, we will think about where the Sumer people lived and the land that they had. We will find out that they lived close to what we would call Iraq today!

Music

Summer 1-Rock anthems. Pupils will listen to a range of songs which will support and enrich their understanding of its theme, while deepening their musical knowledge and experience.

Summer 2- 'You've got a Friend'. Pupils will perform this song in unison and play instrumental parts accurately and in time. They will compose a melody based on a simple rhythm and use this as part of their performance.

Homework

Children in Year 6 are required to do homework almost every night. The amount of homework given is carefully thought out and should never take more than one hour to complete. Included (each night) in this is 20 minutes reading. They should spend 10 minutes on tables and 10 minutes on spellings which are set each week. Each week children will be given either a Grammar or reading task and a Maths task to complete for the following week. Thank you for your support in ensuring your child is in a routine so that he /she completes the task to a good standard and by the due date.
