



The Step 7 Pathway puts your children at the heart of the transfer process, ensuring a smooth journey from primary to secondary education and enabling them to flourish in their new school environment.



Dear Parents/Carers,

As a result of high demand for places in all four of our rapidly improving secondary schools, the trust has decided to introduce the NPCAT Step 7 Pathway from September 2020.

This will ensure we can guarantee you a continuation of NPCAT education and take away any uncertainty in secondary placement allocation.

NPCAT offers excellent primary education within its 23 primary schools across Teesside and North Yorkshire. This year we have 705 pupils leaving Year 6 and have 606 places in Year 7.

Our four secondary schools have had new leadership in place since September 2019 and the impact on pupils' behaviour, attendance, attainment and progress is clearly evident. It has been recognised by the trust through our School Improvement Framework.

Since the formation of the trust we have continued to see an increase in pupil performance and we are confident of continued improvement in GCSE and sixth form outcomes.

As a trust we want to offer all Year 6 pupils the opportunity to remain within our family of Catholic schools. However, the current number of available places for Year 7 pupils is 240 at Trinity, 150 at Sacred Heart, 105 at St Peter's and 111 at St Patrick's. This leaves a shortfall of 99 places.

The Step 7 Pathway eliminates all anxiety and stress and puts children at the heart of the transfer process.

To assist our pupil placement planning, I am requesting that you work with your NPCAT primary school's headteacher and Year 6 teacher to identify which of our secondary schools meets your child's future needs.

This exercise will be followed up by a meeting with the secondary school headteachers, who will set out their vision and outline the wonderful advances being made across secondary education in NPCAT.

This booklet aims to start a conversation and offer key guidance to ensure the transition and transfer to secondary school is personalised, seamless and supportive.

By choosing NPCAT schools you can be assured of quality schooling from the age of two to 19. With us, your family's values and your expectations for your sons and daughters can be realised in a rich and unique school that recognises the individuality of every child and offers education and care that is carefully tailored to his or her needs.










The Step 7 Pathway to Secondary Education

Step 1	Parent/carer completion of electronic form to indicate secondary school choices for September 2021
Step 2	Opportunity for Year 6 pupils to discuss secondary school choices with primary school headteacher
Step 3a	Parent/carer meeting with secondary headteacher for those who identify an NPCAT secondary school as first choice
Step 3b	Parent/carer meeting with secondary headteacher for those who identify an alternative secondary school as first choice
Step 4	Parent/carer visit to chosen NPCAT secondary school
Step 5	Parent/carer meeting with chosen NPCAT secondary school Year 7 leadership team
Step 6	Year 6 pupil visit to NPCAT secondary school/s
Step 7	Meeting between NPCAT primary and secondary headteachers to confirm pupil place allocations for Year 7 in September 2021

Taking The First Step



Choosing your child's secondary school is one of the most important decisions you will make as a parent – and one that you'll want to get right. NPCAT is keen to work in partnership with you from the very beginning of the Step 7 Pathway to make sure that happens.

> At the foot of this page you'll see a link to an electronic form. We would ask all parents of children due to start secondary school in September 2021 to complete the form by Friday 15 May 2020.

Submitting the form is Step 1 on your child's pathway to secondary education. It is designed to gather essential information that will help us to provide you with appropriate advice and guidance about your child's transition into secondary education.

Completing the form will help you ensure that your child is able to continue their journey in

Catholic education. It will also help NPCAT to plan for the number of places we will need to make available in our four secondary schools as demand increases.

Once NPCAT has collated responses, Step 2 of the Step 7 Pathway will begin. We will support you throughout the entire process and you could be contacted by staff from our central team or our schools to discuss how we can best meet your child's needs.
