Capital Investment


Over the summer, significant investment has been made in our educational facilities and estate. Summer is a time when significant capital works can be commissioned and this summer has been no different in terms of scale. However,



with the COVID-19 pandemic unfortunately, some of those projects are in the final phases of completion and over the coming weeks, all will be signed off. Christ the King Primary, Thornaby, St Margaret Clitherow's Primary, South Bank, St Pius X Primary, Middlesbrough, St Bede's Primary, Marske and All Saints Primary, Thirsk have all benefited this summer from trust funding, enhancing and developing new outdoor play and enrichment zones. In addition to this, many roofs and boilers have been upgraded in preparation for the winter ahead. Naturally we do not stay still and this week, we have announced significant funding for St Peter's Catholic College, South Bank. Further major announcements will be made in the next two weeks on additional capital investments in 3 further campuses.



It is vital that if you want to avoid being placed in a school that sits outside your choice that you complete the form accordingly. Trinity Catholic College, Ofsted Visit

Trinity Catholic College yesterday welcomed a team of Her Majesty's Inspectors. The focus of the visit was to scrutinise how the college was addressing the needs of the pupils and staff during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Senior leaders set out the impressive recovery curriculum which has been developed to identify gaps in understanding and knowledge and how these are being bridged. Mrs Dwyer, headteacher, identified the additional targeted resources and strategies including the use of one to one tutors, additional ICT and wider emotional and pastoral support package being deployed by the college.

The Ofsted visit reviewed how staff had generously given up their time during lockdown to ensure all children were supported and with over 5000 parental contacts and an uninterrupted provision for vulnerable children and children of key workers, the college demonstrated a truly remarkable collective effort based on its Catholic ethos.

The new leadership team impressively set out their in-depth understanding of the key challenges of returning all pupils safely to school and how, within just a matter of a couple of weeks behaviour norms and high expectations have been re-established.



The Ofsted inspectors visit is part of a national programme of visits focusing on provision of education during COVID-19 and Trinity's excellent provision was set out coherently and impressively.
