At St Paulinus, we always have a theme when celebrating World Book Day. We love reading so much that we enjoy to share the benefits of reading with our pupils and families. This year, our theme was 'Read to Relax'. It was chosen specifically due to the anxieties that we all face during this global pandemic. During the three World Book Day assemblies, Mrs Bircham shared three benefits of reading as a way to relax:

- Calming It has been discovered that just 30 minutes of reading lowers blood pressure, heart rate and feelings of distress.
- Gets you ready for a good night's sleep reading or being read to at bedtime helps you to switch off and have a really good rest. By switching your thoughts to an imaginary place, you are more likely to fall to sleep quicker and happier.
- It can stop you from feeling down- reading regularly, can reduce and help to manage long term feelings of depression.

Of course, reading goes beyond World Book Day and in School, we believe in the power of Reading for Pleasure and encourage reading as a hobby for all to enjoy.

This Sunday's Gospel reading is John 2:13-25. In this passage, we are presented with a stark contrast of the image of Jesus as being meek and mild.
