<u>Maths</u>

This half term we will be looking at place value. This involves knowing which is the hundreds, tens and units/one's digit, ordering numbers and finding 10 or 100 more and less. During the course of year 3, it is expected that children will know their 2, 5, 10, 3, 4, and 8 times tables and the corresponding divisions. Therefore, any extra practise you can offer will be greatly appreciated.



<u>PE</u>

PE will take place on a Wednesday and Thursday afternoon. On these days, children are to come into school in their PE kits and will stay in them all day.

Please ensure names are written on all items of clothing.

<u>Homework</u>

Spellings will be given on a Friday to be tested the following Friday.

Reading as already mentioned should be daily but should be recorded with an adult at least three times a week.

Children should be practising the times table they are up to (we learn them in this order 2, 10, 5, 3, 4 and 8) and will be tested each week along with spellings. Keep practising! ③


Parent's Evening
