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We are going to start letting the children borrow a book each day to take home and read that night. I am sure it will become a routine of swapping the book when they first come in on a morning or afternoon. We cannot stress enough, the importance of reading to your child every night. It improves the functioning of the brain and fosters concentration. It stimulates their imagination and expands their understanding of the world around them.

Our wonderful outdoor learning space has already been a favourite space for many. Come rain or shine, the children will have access to outside so a coat is needed everyday and hats and gloves when the weather changes. Finally, we have started the weekly pound fund and the tin is just by the door. This small contribution will allow us to provide really exciting additional resources to support the children. We are wanting to provide seasonal produce for the children to experience, flowers for the mud kitchen and plants for the garden. We are also wanting to buy a new reading den for the classroom. We intend to share with you how we have used the money throughout the year.
