




What is a "Zero Hero"?

- We can then use your images and pictures as displays in school and on our social media.




## "Zero Hero" Challenge 2

Use facts / figures / graphs / images / poems / quotes to make your point as clearly and as strongly as you can.


On the first day

light"...






...and there was!

and the darkness night!











On the third day

and grass.









On the fourth day God made the sun, moon and stars!
















Also on the sixth


Day God created man in his own image using the soil from the earth and breathing life into him with his own breath.

He called the man Adam and the woman Eve.










On the seventh day God rested.
